On 4/13/22 the Governor's major initiative named California for All College Corp was launched, with RCC selected as the launching site and designated to lead the educational institutions in Riverside County in successfully recruiting students for the initiative. The governor appointee and his staff, and Tony Thurman, the State Superintendent of Schools, and the Commissioner of this initiative were present. President Anderson was the host and President's Steinback and Green, the Vice Chancellor from UCR and the Dean from College of the Desert were also present. Student speakers were inspiring. Superintendent Thurman expressed his support of many of our programs and asked how he can help. This opportunity was taken to bring attention to the funding disparity between community colleges and the K-12, CSU's and UC's. A second meeting will occur for further discussion.

Final interviews for the General Counsel have concluded and is being finalized with a plan for a start date of June 1. The recruitment for the Vice Chancellor of Educational Services and Strategic Planning is progressing well; three candidates have been forwarded for final interviews with a plan for a start date of July 1.

Tomorrow the district office leadership will conduct a retreat which will be an assessment of where we are with a focus on specific issues. It will be followed with a retreat with the entire cabinet, including areas of alignment, decrease overlap, increase collaboration and improve efficiency, effectiveness, accountability and transparency. Issues of organization and structure will also be discussed.

On April 29, the Inland Empire Workforce Development Summit will take place in Riverside and in attendance will be the California Secretary of the Treasury and the Secretary of Labor as keynote speakers. The Secretary of Labor has requested our presence and a 10-minute presentation on the Inland Empire Technical Trade Center (IETTC) project, of which she is very supportive and wishes to give an official endorsement. The Secretary of Labor will also attend a breakfast at the district office with all key stakeholders.
