I. Approval of the Agenda/MS/Mahon/Johnson/Quin/Mahon

Add to next agenda: (1) Carolyn Quin's Gen Ed Inclusion form (2) Discontinuance of courses with CORs more than five years old.

II. Approval of the minutes as amended (May 29, 2014)/MS/Mahon/Quin/Unanimous

- Richard commented on the suggestion of having an articulation officer visit at each meeting. He felt that we should just invite Nick Franco early on, who prepares the C-IDs for the District, to give us an overview.
- Carolyn asked whether or not Carol Farrar had been notified that the District is no longer updating the Faculty Handbook. This is now the college's responsibility to create their own online faculty handbook. Carolyn will notify Carol of this update.

IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure

a. College Updates

i. Moreno Valley – They will have their first meeting on 10/9. They have a new “Mathematics” department which split off from Science and Kinesiology with Fen Johnson as their representative. Carolyn is expecting to have a report on the Curriculum Institute from Debbi Renfrow. They will also be revising their By-laws so only faculty can vote.

ii. Norco/District – Some points of interest Brian learned from the Curriculum Institute:

- A State-wide Course Exchange Initiative is being developed for Distance Education. If a student cannot get into an online course at RCCD, they can go to this website which will bring up all the other colleges in the state showing which ones have open online courses that students can add.
- Common Assessment Initiative – Twelve colleges will be testing a common assessment system in Spring of 2015. This is an online administered assessment test, and his understanding is that this assessment would go with the student when they transfer to other community colleges in the state.
- Educational Planning Initiative – Three basic goals: (1) to create a state-wide student web portal (2) Online software to create an educational plan (3) build an online degree audit system. This student web portal will allow students to enter all their information in one place so their application, assessment, educational plan and transcripts will go with them to whichever college they transfer to. This is being piloted by eleven colleges in December of 2015.

iii. Riverside/State – RCC has a new Performing Arts Dean and a new Language, Humanities and Social Science Dean that they hope to have joining them as regular guests. They also have a new analyst and some new department representatives. State: Richard mentioned an upcoming event on September 20th for a Southern Regional conversation at the Anaheim Sheraton to convene faculty to review CB21 coding, the number of levels below transfer for English, Math, Reading and ESL. A couple of RCC faculty attended a webinar on the Educational Initiative and felt it was just about developing a system-supported equivalent of Blackboard. They are also developing tutoring support at the system level.

Richard would like RCC to pay more attention to this initiative which he feels would be very beneficial to the colleges. RCC is interested in hosting the Southern California Regional Curriculum meeting on October 18th and participation has been expanded to include administrators and staff.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- a. AP 4260-Limitations on Enrollment: Prerequisites, Co-requisites & Advisories—update
AP 4260 did not pass the RCC senate in June but will be the first order of business next Monday. Once it's approved, it will be used to establish prerequisites.
- b. Discussion of the process for review of the AOE's and GE requirements—to be added to the RCCD CH
Jim Elton and Hayley Ashby, co-chairs of RCC's Assessment Committee joined us today to give an overview of the work that was generated, in the last two years, by the Gen Ed workgroup they established. Recommendations proposed by the workgroup:
 - First year they worked on revising the Gen Ed SLOs and went from bullets to narratives. It will be easier now to align Gen Ed SLOs to the narratives.
 - Second year they dealt with what the changes to the narratives meant to the Gen Ed Program and what the program itself means.
 - Jim prepared a form showing which RCCD Gen Ed courses matched Cal State and UC Gen Ed courses. They found, in a lot of instances, that RCCD's Gen Ed courses did match what the Cal State and UC's had. They also found that there were courses UC and Cal State had in their Gen Ed that RCCD did not.
 - RCCD has a lot of courses that have prerequisites so Jim asked the question, "If you have to take one course before you take two, why would you make these two courses a part of Gen Ed when you only want the introductory course?"
 - Revisions to Gen Ed would require adding units to courses such as Communication, Math, Self-Development, and Global Awareness to meet the narratives. This summer, Jim sent out these recommendations to the workgroup, but received no feedback. Jim handed out these documents to the committee. His plan was to send any feedback to the Assessment Committees and then to the College Curriculum Committees, and then dissolve the Gen Ed Workgroup.
 - Jim's timetable is 80% done but there are still some steps to go forward. (1) To re-write programs with our SLOs in mind. (2) Need a process for inclusion and exclusion to Gen Ed.
 - Is it now the District Curriculum Committee's responsibility to develop the criteria for modifying Gen Ed? Suggestion: Let the College Curriculum Committees know that we anticipate getting a recommendation to pair-down and simplify the Gen Ed SLOs and start that discussion this year. Need to work on the gaps that need to be eliminated in Gen Ed learning and work on the fact that the current program doesn't address all the Gen Ed narratives.
- c. RCCD Curriculum Handbook Update – Carolyn sent Toni's revisions for the inclusion form to the designer. Need to have revised screen shots added.

I. Approval of the Agenda/MS/Mahon/Quin

III. Approval of the Minutes (September 4, 2014)/MS/Mahon/Quin
It was September 9th that Moreno Valley met, not October 9th.

IV. Open Hearing – N/A

V. Curriculum Policy & Procedure

a. College Updates

i. Moreno Valley –met on September 9th. Terry has been telling us that every discipline has a number and it has to do with Financial Aid. If the numbers don't match, the college could lose funding. Top codes and CIP codes have been discussed for 4-5 years. There is a Curriculum Institute presentation for more information. Faculty should be more involved with TOPs codes.

ii. Norco/District –Brian gave a presentation on what he received from the Curriculum Institute and demonstrated what a bad/good method of instruction is. Entry skills are linked to prerequisites. Discussed GE process for revisions. It's very important to get a process in place since it is important to address the accreditation recommendation.

iii. Riverside/State –At the District Senate meeting, Richard gave a succinct presentation on the change to Title V revisions. AP 4260 - District Senate approved it last spring dependent upon RCC approving. First college meeting there are a few new deans and committee members. Distributed article from the Atlantic about a new start up college that is very critical of MOOCs. What does a good course outline look like? Where are we with STEM language? Brian will bring it up at the next meeting. Language is taken directly from Title V. Norco committee suggested that if you want certain methods of evaluation to be mandatory, then put the word "mandatory" in parentheses. Richard stated that courses doing that were being refused C-ID approval. C-ID stipulates something and the course outline says nothing is required. Riverside is hosting the South Regional Curriculum meeting on October 18th. Document of deal breakers for course outline approval—Richard will circulate something in writing.

V. OLD BUSINESS

a. Discussion of the process and criteria for the addition/deletion of courses from the GE requirements- we have a modified proposal. It is based on our discussion from last year. Brian wanted to know if we were going to go with the same revised process as we did with the AoEs. Richard said yes and no. Faculty need

to know the changes to the AoEs. GE belongs to the college. Changes to AoEs are vaguely divisional looking processes that you don't need for GE. Carolyn put on the form the categories for the GE and the names of the AoEs. Need to list the course SLO that aligns with one or more program outlines and explain how it aligns. This body has its own adjunction process. We sent the list of proposed changes to the discipline facilitators, college curriculum committees, Academic Senates, and department chairs. Add early notice, broadly considered, before winter break. Approval of discipline facilitators is not required. Having a DCC meeting on Tuesday during finals week, compile on Thursday, and then Brian will distribute before the end of fall semester. Final approval will be in March. Need separate bold heading, the following guidelines to be included, and a separate bold heading section for the excluded list and list criteria. CTE doesn't have to have their SLOs linked to GE SLOs. It won't exclude them, but will keep them from being automatically included. Our goal is to clean up what we have. Brian will report to District Senate. Approved by consensus. Carolyn will send revised version out.

- b. Curriculum Handbook – Some pages have screen shots created by Chip. We could prepare a narrative and remove the graphics for now until META is implemented. Toni will hear on Monday the status of the META implementation. Which CORs are examples of integrated course outlines? Toni will add a link on the home page showing examples of good CORs.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Discontinuance of courses with CORs more than five years old was in the minutes. RCC resolution went to the Senate and has not been acted on. Title V requires that prerequisites be reviewed every six years or every two years for CTE, with prerequisites every four years by the discipline and updated as part of program review. Many CORs are extremely out of date. ADTs can't go to the Chancellor's office. RCC Curriculum Committee spent three meetings discussing this issue and recommended to the Senate not to schedule classes with CORs five or more years old. This is not a policy, but may be a way to fix the problem.
- b. AP 4021 Program Discontinuance - After 3 ½ years of revisions, we have a Program Discontinuance Policy. Convening a task force and a public information session has been added. One of the criteria of the task force is to identify the number of students still in the program so the college can offer a course one more time in order for those students to be able to obtain the degree/certificate. The timeline for program discontinuance is generally two semesters. Catalog would say no new students admitted. Curriculum Handbook does not address this. Task force decides revitalization or discontinuance. Once discontinued, those minutes should be distributed to Educational Services and to the Curriculum Chairs.

- I. Approval of the Agenda/MSA/Mahon/Quin
Brian asked if the PSY 50 issue should be added to the agenda and the answer was no.
- II. Approval of the Minutes (September 18, 2014) as amended/MSA/Mahon/Quin
- III. Open Hearing – Naomi gave an update on META. A walk-through, by phone, will be conducted on October 16 to make sure the old program aligns with the new program, and possibly in November, the test site will be up so that faculty can see the new version. Then by Spring, hopefully we will have the new version of META implemented and ready for use!
- IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure
 - a. College Updates
 - i. Moreno Valley – Carolyn reported that they are working hard on updating CORs for EMS, Fire, and ADJ Law Enforcement in order to meet the October 14th launch date.
 - ii. Norco/District – Brian reviewed the GE and AoE revision process with his committee. He also reviewed the MOE stem language and they will vote on it at their next meeting. The new GE forms have not yet been sent out to all faculty. Brian will hold a CurricUNET training on Friday, October 17th to review basics, show faculty how to make a course modification and focus on content, along with how to include a DE Proposal. Brian sent out a list of CORs that haven't been updated and has received some feedback. Brian attended his first District Academic Senate meeting last Monday. He reported on the new GE forms and stated that AP 4260 had been approved. At the next senate meeting, Brian will let them know, per AP 4260, that

English, Reading and Math representatives are to be selected to do the content review and he will also report on the C-ID update.

iii. Riverside/State – Richard created a one page document, per his committee’s request, summarizing what the common issues are that we face here at the District Tech Review Committee that cause us to send things back such as: the texts are too old, MOEs are generic, CORs linked to old GE SLOs, etc. Richard will e-mail his summary to the committee chairs for their feedback. Richard had also started working on a document two years ago called “Implication of COR Approval” regarding issues that come up that have a scheduling or resource implication. Richard reported that the RCC Senate is considering a resolution to deal with updated CORs.

State: A C-ID meeting will be held in Ontario on October 18th to start discussing how colleges will comply with SB440. Need to encourage faculty to attend! Richard reported on issues that the State Chancellor’s Office has had with regards to curriculum: (1) Due to the long absence of having no Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs, staff started making decisions by themselves. (2) Fifth version of the PCAH added language stating that all courses in ADTs must be awarded a letter grade, but Title 5 language states that pass/fail courses such as a “D” would default to fail, not to pass.

Discussion of GE proposals followed.

Motion – to take a proposal to the college curriculum committees which states that for all DE proposals required, if the underlying course outline is out of date, it will be updated simultaneously/MS/Mahon/Quin/Unanimous

To be added to the college curriculum committee’s agendas for October 14th.

I. OLD BUSINESS

- a. Discussion of the process and criteria for the addition/deletion of courses from the GE requirements- Draft Inclusion/exclusion form – The committee will agree by consensus whether or not to approve the addition or deletion of courses from the GE requirements. Add “Final Version” watermark to GE forms. Deadline for submission to college curriculum committee is October/November and December is the deadline for submission to the District Curriculum Committee. Should GE proposals be withheld due to outdated CORs? *(Remove from agenda)*
- b. Curriculum Handbook – GE process and forms will be added to the Curriculum Handbook and possibly a narrative with screen shots to show how to operate CurricUNET. *(Remove from agenda)*
- c. MOE STEM language – Norco will vote on this at their next meeting and it has been approved by MVC and RCC. A discussion followed regarding PSY 50. This course has not been approved for intensive lab. It’s not clear what the discipline wants.

II. NEW BUSINESS

- a. C-ID update - Nick Franco, the District Articulation Officer, handed out his latest C-ID progress report. He stated that if there is a conditional designation on the submission and there are only a couple of things that need to be modified, it needs to be re-submitted by the expiration date; otherwise, it will be reviewed as a new

submission! Once approved, only need to re-submit if the descriptor changes or there are modifications to be made. Nick agreed to participate in future DCC meetings from time to time.

- I. Approval of the Agenda as amended/MSC/Quin/Mahon
Add under Opening Hearing - Update on META; under New Business add “b. GE Patterns” and c. “Non-Transferrable Courses in AoEs”; and add “ENG 16 for Norco” under Information Items.
- II. Approval of the Minutes (October 2, 2014) as amended/MSC/Mahon/Quin
Remove last sentence, 1st paragraph under IV.iii., and remove last half of paragraph under “State”.
- III. Open Hearing – Update on META
A telephone conference was held last week with Steve Thyberg, and a second one will be held tomorrow. Steve is walking Sylvia, Naomi and Toni through what the screens look like as everything is being migrated over. They are hopeful that META will be ready for implementation by spring 2015. The program looks different but is more intuitive and more cohesive.
- IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure
 - a. College Updates
 - i. Moreno Valley – Worked on updating all CORs to have a successful launch on October 14th. DEH courses were launched and held. Some were launched that shouldn’t have been launched. Who is responsible for updating the Senior Citizen Education CORs prepared by Cyndi Pardee in 2008? Contact Robert Grajeda to find out if there is a plan to update these CORs. If not, would he be willing to do it?
 - ii. Norco/District – Brian reported that the majority of the meeting was discussion on PSY 50, 51 and 55. The plan is to vote on it at the next college meeting once they’ve had time to make a list and review courses with intensive labs to see what constitutes an intensive lab. They did vote in favor of the stem change.

Committee also reviewed the Deal Breakers document. **District** – Important discussion items this last year were Repeatability, AP 4260, Gen Ed AoE revision process and Curriculum Handbook. Most of these items have now been resolved. Brian will ask his committee for additional discussion items that need to be placed on the agenda.

- iii. Riverside/State – Richard reported on the resolution his committee came up with which states that CORs more than five years will not be offered. It was voted on at the third RCC Senate discussion. The vote was 9 ayes, 7 nays, and 4 abstentions so motion failed. Richard pointed out what happens when CORs are not updated: (1) ADTs cannot be submitted; (2) disciplines having C-ID issues will ultimately be revoked for approval by the Chancellor’s Office. Richard asked RCC Senate President to add this back to their next agenda as unfinished business, not for action. Richard asked the question “What kind of mechanism can be put into place to keep CORs up to date?” The major responsibility of faculty is curriculum. We are only hurting the students when we don’t offer a course. A better strategy might be to go to the District Senate with this issue.

Richard would like to agendized for future discussion the issue of allowing mode delivery to be determined on a college vote where the faculty feel there are concerns about whether or not a course can be adequately taught. This issue came up due to a faculty member wanting to make Art 1 and 2 into fully online courses, but the Art History faculty at RCC feel these courses should not be offered in this mode.

 - Program for Fall Senate Plenary Session November 13-15, 2014 and AB86 activities in the District.
 - RCC Senate again rejected RCC Curriculum Committee’s resolution regarding out of date CORs. (*See full report attached*)

Sylvia stated that the CIPR is changing dramatically now that the colleges are doing their own thing, so it’s imperative that the curriculum revision piece be addressed. This topic needs to be placed on a future agenda for discussion on how this is going to take place.

Discussion regarding a faculty member’s question on how can MAT 37 be ok regarding articulation and transfer being able to bypass MAT 35 and go into MAT 12? We need to be careful expressing how students get into MAT 12 through the MAT 37 door. A blanket matriculation appeal is worrisome. Another issue is that MAT 37 is a non-degree applicable course.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- a. COR lecture/lab topics – How do we separate them out? Need a standard way of doing this. This separation of lecture and lab topics came from the C-ID descriptors. Naomi developed a list of the courses that are in current ADTs that have been approved that either have conditional or no C-ID approval. If we don't take care of the C-IDs that haven't been approved, we run the risk of having our degree deactivated. Naomi will send her list out to the committee. If C-IDs haven't been approved by June, we will not be able to submit the ADTs.
- b. “Deal Breakers” document – Richard submitted this document to the RCC Curriculum Committee and told them to take it to their departments and bring back any concerns. Sylvia and Carolyn will send Richard their revisions and once the document has been edited, Carolyn would like to include it in the Curriculum Handbook.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

- a. GE Patterns – Carolyn stated that the MVC committee unanimously passed a motion to propose that there be three options for students for AoEs. The only option that they currently have is the AoE plus the RCCD General Education pattern so Carolyn would like to propose that the students be given the option of AoE plus IGETC or AoE plus CSU Gen Ed. Discussion followed.
 - Carolyn thought that students not taking the right courses will have to start all over again. That's not the case. They might just have to take a couple more courses.
- b. DE Approval Process – Discussion regarding how some courses should only be taught face to face. The chairs need to take back to their committees the question, “Should each college be able to decide, on its own merits, mode of delivery?” Or, if two colleges say they have a course they don't think lends itself towards distance delivery, then should that become binding across the District? Now, because of ACCJC's new interpretation, the colleges may have to submit Substantive Change Reports since many of their degrees will now be offered with courses which are DE thus making the degrees/certificates able to be completed 50% or more online.
- c. Non-transferable courses in AoEs – At the Southern Regional Curriculum Meeting, it was stated that to use IGETC and CSU, it has to be a transfer degree and the AoEs contain some courses that are not transferrable which may be a problem. Richard suggested that Brian take this issue to the District Senate and let them know that this conversation has begun at MVC; and that the District Curriculum Committee feels it has merit and would they like District Academic Standards to take a look at it?
- d. Process for items like PSY-50; College first? – Judy Perry heard about the PSY-50 issue and told Brian that they have a lot of Gaming labs that fall under this intensive lab so what does she need to do to get on the college agenda? Brian told her that she would have to submit a rationale and the committee stated that she would also need to do major modifications for all her classes. Brian was

advised to let Judy know that once they have a process in place, she will be able to submit it for the college agenda at that time.

Curriculum Committee Report to District Curriculum Committee, 11/6/14

- At the Oct. 18 Southern California Regional Meetings, I was struck by the increasing pace of change in matters closely related to curriculum: Not just 1440 degrees, but *440* degrees; *three* state technology initiatives (OEI, common assessment, and ed planning). AB 86. I'm also concerned that MVC & Norco seemed not to be represented, and especially as regards MVC since the senate president pays (in my view) insufficient attention to state initiatives. I know attending such events is challenging (I missed the curriculum regional last year), but the number of issues in play means that colleges have to be paying close attention.

Example: continued receipt of SSSP money is now tied to a college's acceptance of the common assessment tool, which had previously been described as option.

- The Fall Senate Plenary session is Nov. 13-15. I've attached the program and highlighted the sessions that have potential significant curricular impact: there's a lot going on.

- I asked at DCC last year about AB86 activities in the district and was referred to the minutes of a workgroup at Norco. I announced at the Oct. 28, 2014 RCC Curriculum committee meeting that faculty are not very involved in AB86 discussions at RCCD. I was corrected and told that Carla Reible is involved. I called Carla and she told me she was asked to participate by RCC CTE dean Patti Avila, and that she has been involved "since the beginning," in late September. She was only dimly aware of the conversations that began last year—and the Nov. 6 Tech Review agenda has new *credit* curriculum linked to AB86, which involves noncredit curriculum. I think we need to demand as the district Curriculum Committee that the District Academic Senate demand the appointment of faculty approved by the Senate(s).

- The RCC Senate again (Nov. 3) rejected the RCC Curriculum Committee resolution concerning out of date course outlines. Where discussion preceding the earlier vote included some understandable venting, the Nov. 3 vote was preceded by comments from several senators who (1) reported trying repeatedly and unsuccessfully to update CORs due to problems with either the functioning of CurricUNET or feedback from the Tech Review Committee. The most compelling of these comments came from the RCC Life Sciences department, and the claim was explicitly made that the department has limited feedback from the department's curriculum committee rep.—who most senators know to be Greg, our Tech Review chair. Ironically, both motions (Oct. 13 and Nov. 4) received more *aye* than *nay* votes, but when abstentions were included, the motion failed. If either meeting had enjoyed full attendance, I think the motion might have passed.

Upon completion of MAT 37, there would an exam given, and if students successfully pass, then that is considered to be the challenge to get into MAT 12. The question is whether this would be acceptable to the UC's. If not, then the argument could be they are not accepting Title 5's interpretation of allowing a student to challenge a prerequisite. RCC has a letter from the UC Board of Admissions which states that MAT-37 is equivalent to K-8 math, and they would not consider this appropriate preparation for MAT-12. This UC issue needs to be resolved.
- III. Open Hearing – N/A
- IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure
 - a. College Updates
 - i. Moreno Valley – Postponed a number of items on their agenda. They are still discussing the DE proposal for the Art History class and still talking with Math faculty. MVC has a lot of course deletions coming through because of faculty not wanting to assess a course because it hadn't been taught or they don't want to teach it. MVC is still working hard on curriculum. MVC has a department chair off on FMLA, who was also the discipline facilitator. So now this leaves them with multiple CTE courses that have not been approved.
 - ii. Norco/District – Discussed AoE GE patterns and Norco is on board with including those different GE patterns for the AoEs. Norco discussed the DE proposal process and the ART-2 issue and will continue with these

discussions at the next meeting. Norco may submit a resolution supporting the idea of a separate process for DE approvals for a multi-college course. Brian will discuss the AoE GE pattern with the District Senate on Monday and whether or not this should be under the purview of District Academic Standards.

There has been a discussion with the District Senate President about forming another GE Workgroup which would possibly report back to this committee. Two issues to consider: (1) The former GE Workgroup had a recommendation to reduce the number of GE course options; and (2) allowing students to bypass RCCD GE by doing IGETC or CSUGE with an AoE or an AS.

- iii. Riverside/State – Richard gave his State report from the Fall Plenary Session (see full report attached). He emphasized two items: (1) Online Education Initiative – RCC faculty don't see this as an important issue. What they don't understand is that the State LMS will have diagnostic testing and tutoring built into it; (2) Tech Initiatives - This would give us the tools to migrate courses from existing LMS's. Richard sees it having significant potential to change what small colleges can do in curriculum terms. Two resolutions: (1) Calling for the Chancellor's Office to develop a common course management system, i.e., a replacement for CurricUNET since they are having problems implementing META. This is not a high priority; (2) Repeatability - A resolution was passed to start looking into the impact of the changes in Art courses. In taking out repeatability, this may make it harder for students to be art students in community colleges. Richard continues to have ongoing conversations about ART-2.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- a. DE Approval Process – MVC curriculum committee would have supported the DE proposal as it was presented, but Carolyn asked them to postpone the vote and just continue with their dialogue. A list is compiled once a year by Open Campus showing how many degrees and certificates consist of 50% or more DE courses. A student can complete their Gen Ed online since Gen Ed is very close to being 50% of every degree. RCC voted against the ART-2 DE issue and one faculty member thought this might be a good time to see how the appeal process works.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Curriculum Review and CIPR – **Concern:** Since COR review has been tied to CIPRs, and one college has decided to have all CIPRs due the same year, it will not be possible for all CORs to be reviewed in the same year! It was suggested that this committee consider another four year rotation for the COR review and updates. MVC has started talking about this already. MVC CTE faculty would like to determine their own rotation but everyone needs to be on the same rotation! Another suggestion is to have a different rotation, not only for CORs and CIPRs, but also for GE PLOs, SLOs, CTEs, etc. to make sure nothing overlaps. It was suggested that this committee could develop a draft schedule to send to the colleges for their feedback to see what they think and what suggestions they may have.

General Sessions

Tech Initiatives (*Thursday morning*)

3 California Community Colleges Technology Initiatives were discussed in General Session. As your representatives at this conference, we thought you might to learn about the latest funded initiatives in motion at the state level.

Educational Planning Initiative (EPI): cccedplan.org

This initiative will develop an educational planning tool that can serve as a local student services portal, educational planning tool and degree audit system. 10 pilot colleges have agreed to test the first release of the tool. It will provide automated student ed plans, degree audits, online orientation and possibly reporting features for SSSP needs.

Services discussed were:

- A federated ID for students
- CCC apply access
- E transcripts
- Ability to be integrated into any software used by the local college
- Ability to talk to Assist 2 and CID
- Access to 10 years of curriculum history
- Customize matriculation information
- Collect “preferences” of students (like Amazon does) and customize messaging to the student to lead students towards successful completion of their goals.

This is entirely voluntary for each college.

California Common Assessment Initiative (CAI): cccassess.org

With a projected rollout of Fall 2016, this is a faculty-driven initiative that will result in a common assessment tool that provides test preparation, delivery, administration, data collection and course placement guidance.

Currently the faculty team has developed 8 level of skills for ESL testing and 4 levels of skills for English (including reading) and Math. These competencies (skills) are available for faculty review on the website. Common Core competencies map to these developed competencies.

The acceptance of this assessment tool is mandated by the State and SSSP funding is tied to its adoption by each college. Although multiple measures for placement can be used, adoption of this test is mandatory or funding is denied.

The initiative is asking for input from Math, English and Reading faculty now on the competencies and questions like “Should it require a writing sample.”

Online Education Initiative (OEI): ccconlineed.org

This initiative originally began as an attempt to head off Steinberg’s bill on the adoption of MOOCs by the community colleges. The timeline suggests that by Fall 2015 a common course management system will be ready for piloting at 24 colleges around the state. Colleges can opt into the CMS; this is a voluntary initiative.

Pat James has been hired as Executive Director and the initiative is looking at:

- Bringing on a tutoring vendor by Fall;
- Developing a student readiness module by summer for downloading by those who might want to use them;
- Forming a library services group to look at just in time resources; and
- Creating an “Exchange.”
 - In the Exchange, colleges could serve as “home” colleges and provide courses that have C-ID numbers for access by any community college student.
 - Colleges could allow their students to take Exchange classes and receive credit at your institution.
 - Or colleges could serve as both.
 - Right now our students “swirl:” they apply to a second college and take courses and their transcripts are exchanged but those students might lose part of their financial aid because the unit load is smaller at each college. The Exchange will help with this.
- Colleges can opt into the CMS system and not participate in the exchange.
- Looking at integrating e-portfolios into the CMS system.
- Looking at offering a proctoring network or vendor system.

Adult Ed/Noncredit (Thursday noon)

As curriculum committee members know, there has been considerable attention to adult ed/noncredit instruction over the past year as the result of the passing of AB86. Faculty have been generally left out of these discussions at RCC, where Norco has organized RCCD participation. At least one reason for the RCCD colleges to pay closer attention is the fact that apportionment for noncredit courses in a program has been equalized to the credit FTES level. Since RCCD remains in a growth region in the state, this equalization could allow RCCD to serve more students and be fully funded for them (in the past, the apportionment rate for noncredit was well below the credit level. SEE: **Adult Ed Curriculum**

System Metrics (Friday Morning)

The Friday General Session was provided by CCCCCO Vice Chancellor Patrick Perry and focused on the system metrics adopted by the BOG in July 2-14. Where the system metrics seem to have been presented at RCCD as a major step toward performance based funding, Patrick's presentation seemed to reject that interpretation rather emphatically. Patrick's presentation are usually accompanied by very detailed PowerPoint documents, and that will be shared once it is available on the Academic Senate website.

Brown Act Update

Most local senates and their standing committees around the state are aware of the obligation to record the votes of individual members. There was a breakout on the topic presented by legal counsel from the Chancellor's Office. Most RCCD senate committees are in compliance.

Curriculum Hot Topics

Most topics covered had already been addressed at the southern California Curriculum regional conference RCC hosted on Oct. 18, but more detail was provided on (1) Units to Hours, (2) Staffing issues in the Chancellor's Office and curriculum approval, (3) an update to the PCAH, and (4) auditing.

Distance Ed

Distance Ed has always been high profile topic, as it overlaps accreditation, curriculum, and funding issues. This is an area where RCCD is somewhat ahead of other colleges, some of which continue to struggle with processes to ensure regular effective contact.

Dual Enrollment

The RCC Senate has been discussing RCCD AP5011 the question of the enrollment of high school students for multiple meetings without achieving much clarity. There was a breakout on a number of issues that have in common the transition of high school students to CCC campuses.

Online Education Initiative

The RCC Curriculum Committee has been aware of this issue going back to last year. As indicated above, the initiative is making rapid progress. Informal enthusiasm at RCC has been modest. The initiative includes not only a common LMS (=WebTV, BlackBoard, Moodle, etc.), but also planning for readiness assessment, counseling, and tutorial support. The pilot colleges have already been identified so RCCD participation would follow testing.

Resolutions (Saturday)

The largest grouping of resolutions is usually in the area of curriculum. Among the resolutions adopted this session:

- 9.01: Proposes to overturn a Chancellor's Office decree that all "transfer" AAs (not just ADTs) **must** require either CSU Breadth or IGETC
- 9:02: Encourages colleges to report to the Chancellor's Office certificates *below* 18 units (this increased the reported number of completions).
- 9.03: Calls for the reinstating of local approval of standalone courses.
- 9.04: Calls for faculty involvement in all levels of review and approval for CCC baccalaureate degrees.
- 9.05: Calls for faculty to be involved in the defining of upper-division GE (CSU requires upper division GE, UC does not).
- 9.06: Calls for the updating of the Senate's 2008 *The Course Outline of Record* paper.
- 9.07: Seeks funding to support C-ID work for courses *below* transfer level.
- 9.08: Calls for research and report out on the impact of changes to regulations regarding repeatability (especially in arts programs).
- 9.09: Calls for CCCCCO support to develop a statewide curriculum management system (i.e., an alternative to CurricUNET).
- 9.10: Requests that the Chancellor's office release ADT templates only twice a year, on Feb. 1 and Sept. 1.
- 9.11: Promotes ongoing TMC development, even when programs cannot conform to SB1440 (due to high lower division unit requirements).
- 9.12: Supports continued viability of local degrees not developed to support SB1440.
- 9.13: Supports the Academic Senate as continued guiding force behind C-ID (C-ID is up for bid and could be taken over by a district not inclined to work with the Senate or faculty in general).

Carolyn is willing to research PLOs for similar types of programs online and come up with some suggestions for our spring agenda.

IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure

a. College Updates

- i. Moreno Valley – Carolyn’s two-page summary of items was not approved because of so much activity among faculty on curriculum; particularly CTE programs that had been outdated for so long and their process did not scale very well to high volume. One particular item discussed was that the committee did not agree to exclude certain courses due to faculty deleting them because of assessment challenges, etc.
- ii. Norco/District – Brian reported that Sarah Burnett volunteered to be on the GE Workgroup which should be back up and running by spring. Diane reported that Norco was the first to implement the new Viability and Discontinuance Policy. They voted on eleven programs and voted to discontinue all of them. She will send their recommendations forward to this committee for approval. They identified a couple of

things in the AP that may need revising: (1) Students need to be included in the membership, and (2) the AP states that the task force's recommendations will be submitted to the District Curriculum Committee but it doesn't specify what action they should take.

iii. Riverside/State – Richard tended to action items only with minimal discussion on policy and procedures so the meeting ended at 3:55!

Need to ask Sylvia to discuss this issue with evaluators first.

- The college committees have not approved the AOE/GE proposals listed below. Need to be separated out for each college.
- Not our place today to discuss the merits of the proposals. We need to be clear about the process so that the disciplines and departments at all three colleges know what proposals are going forward, and in spring, hopefully the curriculum committees will have developed a process to determine how to approve or not approve.
- Brian will communicate to the District Senate decisions made on the AoE/GE proposals and Curriculum Chairs will make sure department chairs, discipline facilitators and faculty are aware of these proposals.
- Committee accepted Judy Perry's late submission of proposals but requested that she re-submit just the entry level courses on the appropriate forms to Naomi by December 15th. Courses need to be updated to be included in an AoE and linked to the new GE SLOs. These forms can be submitted electronically to Naomi.
- In regards to the discussion on CTE courses not being allowed into an AoE, it was stated that there are some CTE courses that are transferrable and count towards GE. That being said, we shouldn't make any gross statements about any discipline or type of course, but let each course be evaluated on its own merit in alignment with the criteria set forth.

- II. Approval of the Minutes as amended (December 11, 2014)/MSA/Mahon/Quin/Unanimous Completed Motion for ENG-44 under Major Course Modifications (voted by e-mail)
- III. Open Hearing – What is the timeline to research PLOs for similar types of programs online and come up with suggestions and to invite the three Assessment Committee chairs to our meeting? Richard will follow-up and find out if the final draft of the Gen Ed Workgroup report is done and Sylvia has asked the District Senate to agendaize the re-convening of the Gen Ed Workgroup. The idea was that the curriculum committees could best serve the District and colleges by suggesting criteria that could be used. The curriculum chairs will address this issue this spring once the final report has been presented.

Concern about prerequisites for CTE courses being reviewed every two years along with the validity of the program. In addition to meeting all three criteria set forth in Title 5, the colleges are waiting for a Dean of Instruction for CTE at MVC so they can all come together collaboratively to review CTE prerequisites and validity of the programs. Some faculty did not realize that they have to also review their curriculum in CurricUNET. Once all three CTE Deans are in place, we can add to this our agenda to reconsider at that time.

- IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure
 - a. College Updates
 - i. Moreno Valley – Carolyn reported that because of the pressure for assessment, faculty were removing courses that had not been assessed from the curriculum inventory. This problem was rectified after Carolyn had a discussion with them and they are keeping the courses which were proposed for deletion/exclusion.

- ii. Norco/District – Brian reported that they had a discussion about the Gen Ed Workgroup and Sarah Burnett had agreed to join the group. Another issue was the Associate’s degree which Rex Beck feels the students should have the option of choosing from other GE patterns such as CSU or IGETC.
District – no report.
- iii. Riverside/State – Richard announced that this spring would be his last semester as RCC curriculum chair. The committee needs to start thinking about who should step forward as the new chair. Richard feels that a .4000 release time would be appropriate for the chair especially in the Fall since the chair will be attending senate meetings also.
State – Regarding the three technology initiatives, two have made announcements that Accuplacer will be going away. Remote Learner, Blackboard and Canvas made it to the final stage for consideration for being the state adopted learning management system for all online instruction in the state. We are currently in year two of a five-year contract with Blackboard so we are not able to switch to Canvas at this time.
Two questions to ponder: (1) What does training look like for the curriculum committees as required by the revised AP 4260. This committee needs to agendaize and review forms to come up with a plan to put into action for the college committees. (2) Do we need faculty to complete assessments on all SLOs (imposed on us by C-ID) or have them select the ones they feel are most important and commit to doing those on a regular basis? We definitely need the objectives.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- a. DE Approval Process – (Remove from agenda)
- b. Curriculum Review and CIPR- How can we review all CORs if one college completes all their program reviews next year? MVC is using TracDat for all their Program Reviews (CIPRs and APRs) in which the dates of the CORs are in the course assessment module which can easily be pulled into the Program review module thus keeping track of COR dates could be more easily accomplished.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Logistics Management and IGETC/CSUGE pattern – Discussion about whether we should we consider letting students have the option of choosing from other GE patterns such as CSU or IGETC. This would be based on a recommendation to the Senate. Brian will forward to Rex and let him know that he should tell his curriculum committee that he thinks this is something that would benefit their students and to either adopt a resolution that would be recommended to the other two colleges or to begin a formal discussion and ask the other two colleges if they would consider it as well. Once the colleges have come to an agreement, then it would be submitted to the three college senates.
- b. C-ID status of courses in ADTs – The State Chancellor’s office has changed their minds about deactivating degrees whose courses have not received approved CID status. However, after July 1 they will no longer accept for submission degree applications for ADTs if the courses within do not have CID approved status. A spreadsheet has been prepared of all of the existing ADTs listing the C-ID status of

the courses within them. All courses have to be approved for C-ID if any modifications are made to an ADT after July 1st. This spreadsheet will be sent to Carolyn and Brian. Sylvia will ask the District Academic Senate to agendaize it for their next meeting on Monday.

III. Open Hearing – Process for modifying AOE's and GE's will go into the Curriculum Handbook after final touches are completed. Possible change to the timeline since it seems not to reach April Board deadlines in time. Start in October? We are again moving toward not having compliant degrees by not limiting the addition of courses and not having requests to remove any courses. Conversation with three senate presidents and their suggestion was to postpone the inclusion any courses in the GE requirements until the GE workgroup has completed their work. Discussion of how many courses have gone through the approval process this year- one course and so the Senate will allow the one course (EAR-20) to be added to the GE. The reasoning is that there could be removal of courses from the GE and thus adding in courses now which might be removed next year seems counter-productive.

Program review in 5 year cycle which starts next year, 2016, at RCC. So will there be a disconnecting of program review from the updating of course outlines? Will RCC review all their course outlines next year and update them? What are the consequences of each college having a different review cycle? Conversation needs to be done with all three colleges.

AP4260 has not had final approval-Chancellor's cabinet needs to review for it to be posted to the website.

Modification to Guidance courses had not been launched in time.

IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure

a. College Updates

- i. Moreno Valley – Carolyn reported that the IGETC and CSUGE pattern were approved by the curriculum committee and the college academic senate to be added as local options for general education requirements for all degrees. Discussion took place regarding whether there was a specific request to also exclude the “additional degree requirements.” Technically the additional degree requirements of health and self-development are not general education requirements. Title 5 defines GE as the 4 groups which does not include the Health and Self Development. Health and Self-development might have been rooted in the past philosophy that physical activity is good for all students.
- ii. Norco/District – Brian reported that they approved all items except LIB-1 and discussed IGETC and CSUGE and discussed waiving the general education requirements as well as the additional degree requirements when a student has earned a bachelor’s degree from a regionally accredited college. At issue is the work load/time needed to evaluate, Sylvia will discuss this with the evaluators. Kevin stated that 10% of the student population at Norco has a bachelor’s degree. District-GE work group will be reconvened and so GE requirements might be changed.
- iii. Riverside/State – Richard stated that they put together ad hoc committees to review the AOE/GE requests and will vote on those at the next meeting. Will discuss to add IGETC and CSUGE. Will begin also to discuss the work from the GE workgroup.
State – March 21 Academic Senate regional meetings on non-credit and DE at Mt. Sac.

- I. Approval of the Agenda/MS/Quin/Burchett
- II. Approval of the Minutes (March 5, 2015)/MS/Burchett/Quin
- III. Open Hearing – Carolyn brought up an issue that she thought faculty should be alerted to regarding updating of CORs. The Communications Department wanted to update and initiate revisions to their CORs, last updated in 2011, for their CIPR due Fall 2015. They contacted RCC faculty and were told no, they could not update their CORs. The issue was resolved with RCC calling to say they finally agreed the CORs could be updated. Carolyn wants more conversation on what the curriculum issues are when CIPRs are on different cycles.
- IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure
 - a. College Updates
 - i. Moreno Valley – During their meeting, there was a power outage and a mandatory evacuation as they were discussing the Gen Ed Workgroup Report so their meeting was cut short. MVC approved including CSUGE and IGETC as their local RCCD GE patterns. Carolyn stated that the MVC Senate approved their CSUGE and IGETC as their local GE patterns with the understanding that the additional requirements still stand.
 - ii. Norco/District – Norco approved including CSUGE and IGETC as their local RCCD GE patterns along with taking the additional graduation requirements. Brian will submit Norco's recommendation to the senate and he can let them know the recommendations of the other two colleges. The District Senate will most likely wait until RCC has submitted their recommendation before approving. Norco also approved recommending that students with a bachelor's degree, from a regionally accredited university, would automatically meet the RCCD local GE requirements.

The evaluators would be o.k. with doing this since they are already doing it for the Nursing students. Brian spoke with Arend Flick and Greg Aycock and they will be attending Norco's next meeting to review the Gen Ed documents from the previous workgroup. The senate appointed Hayley Ashby to convene the first meeting of the Gen Ed workgroup.

- iii. Riverside/State – RCC is still discussing the IGETC and CSUGE as local patterns and a decision will be made at their next meeting. Sylvia stated that the Senate really wants a unanimous vote and most likely would hold up making their decision until all three colleges agree given that this involves the degree pattern.
 - Richard joined us by phone to discuss the issue of changing objectives to SLOs in the COR. He stated that several people on the Assessment Committee were very excited about the possibility of separating the objectives and outcomes and giving the faculty the ability to be more selective of which SLOs they would be committed to. Need to decide where to put the SLOs - in another field in the COR or in another CurricUNET document?
 - The C-ID template is labeled course objective so Richard would be hesitant to move too much content out of the field where C-ID evaluators think that they are most likely to find them. Can they be combined and call them all objectives? Or have one list with all the objectives and call some of them SLOs? These options seem more difficult than having two separate fields for objectives and SLOs. Having two separate fields for SLOs and objectives would help make the transition to META easier.
 - Richard suggested raising the issue for discussion, not for action, at the curriculum committees and ask faculty to go back to their departments and see if they perceive any value in a conversation about this change.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- a. Curriculum Review and CIPR and COR updates – *remove from next agenda.*
- b. GE Work group – Hayley Ashby to convene first meeting of the Gen Ed Workgroup. Sylvia's office will find a date that works for everyone.
- c. Prerequisite Training – AP 4260 update – On the agenda for Chancellor's Cabinet for April 20th. Carolyn will discuss content review and how they are going to address prerequisites at their next meeting on April 28th. Can hold off on prerequisite training until then.

Differentiate characteristics of typical and atypical development. <p>EAR-20 incorporates the General Education program Student Learning Outcomes with the development Critical Thinking and Self-Development & Global Awareness. The course is transferable to CSUs, UCs, as well as most four-year universities. It is on the IGETC certification transfer list. (Interestingly, most Multiple Subject Teaching Credential programs require Child Growth and Development for the graduate program and accept the RCC EAR-20 as fulfilling the requirement.)</p> <p>EAR-20 is quite similar to Psychology 9 in studying Developmental Psychology. In fact, several EAR-20 and PSY-9 instructors use the same textbook: The Developing Person by K. Berger, Worth Publishing, 2013.</p> <p>Honestly, a course explicitly focused on human children developing socially and behaviorally, not to mention cognitive and emotionally development, should be included in the Social and Behavioral Sciences category of the GE course list.</p> <p>I would be happy to provide further information and/or documentation for justification. - I. Approval of the Agenda/MS/Quin/Mahon
- II. Approval of the Minutes (March 19, 2015)/MS/Quin/Mahon / (1) abstention
Discussion – Richard has suggested various possibilities for the next RCC Curriculum Chair. He also mentioned that he feels a .2 reassign time for Fall is inadequate for the workload at RCC. Sylvia would lobby for an increase.
- III. Open Hearing – Announcement on META - Sylvia mentioned that they have had several conversations with Steve and he has given them a Go Live date in May. This is an improved version of CurricUNET which is very promising! We will wait for the rollout before mentioning a new field for objectives. Discussion followed regarding TracDat and SLOs.

Naomi asked Brian if the Senate had approved the transfer for Associate in Science in Biology – (under Information, VIII. 8). Brian had asked for it to be put on the agenda but doesn't know if it has been approved yet. April 23rd District Curriculum meeting has been cancelled! Next meeting is May 7th.

IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure

- a. College Updates
 - i. Moreno Valley – the committee passed the local GE substitution, the IGETC and CSUGE Gen Ed with their senate's approval also. MVC approved the baccalaureate which satisfies the requirements of GE with the additional degree requirements. The April meeting will focus on the content review and validation of prerequisites and how they plan to approach it.

Two specific issues that Title 5 requires: (1) a plan must be submitted to the board, and (2) language that states “before the Curriculum Committee starts approving such courses, there has to be training.”

- ii. Norco/District- Good discussion with Arend Flick and Greg Aycock who attended the meeting and gave the committee information from the old Gen Ed Workgroup. **District** – District Senate approved the IGETC and CSUGE as options for their local GE pattern. Senate’s final decision is contingent upon approval from all three colleges. RCC will vote on it at their next meeting. Hearing that MVC has approved the waiving of the GE requirements and additional graduation requirements for those who already have a Bachelor’s degree, Brian asked that RCC agendaize this for their approval as well, which Richard has done. Brian briefly discussed at the Senate meeting the reconvening of the Gen Ed Workgroup. Sylvia is waiting for confirmation of the committee members and will help Hayley Ashby convene the first meeting. Brian will be attending a one day curriculum meeting in San Francisco during spring break.
- iii. Riverside/State – RCC voted unanimously to approve the substitution of IGETC or CSUGE in place of RCCD GE requirements for all degree seekers. Richard did not agendaize this and the other GE requirements for the same meeting so as not to cause any confusion. The District Senate will now be able to move forward with approval from all three colleges after RCC senate approves on Monday. Richard sent information to the committee regarding the training that will be provided. So far no one has stepped up to replace Richard as RCC Curriculum Chair and he will be in Italy in Fall!

State – One of the resolutions was on the new standard IB.6 that requires the colleges to disaggregate student learning outcome data. What’s the point of disaggregating if the numbers are so small? The State Chancellor’s office has started rejecting Associate degrees that exceed 60 units. They are rejecting courses that are not transferrable saying they are not degree applicable.

Sylvia asked Richard about a new accreditation standard that says “the institution will regularly evaluate and improve the quality and currency of all instructional programs and continuing and *community education courses*”. Richard answered that this recommendation could be met for community education courses by simply having a form of assessment appropriate to the curriculum that is offered, and not be very inclusive or critical in terms of what you choose to do.

There was a lot of discussion about the Online Education Initiative at one of the Senate regional meetings this spring. When this was shared with the DE Committee at RCC and the Chancellor’s Cabinet, it was seen primarily as a tool for colleges to equalize FTEs. Two things are part of this proposal: (1) readiness testing, and (2) tutorial services that will be built into the initiative. There has been an overwhelming show of support for Canvas and there are now more colleges wanting to change.

RCC has an ongoing discussion about whether or not they want to continue to be locked into the number of SLOs that the C-ID descriptors stipulate. Maybe the number of SLOs could be reduced by shifting them into the course content section. Richard asked the chairs to take this back to their committees for further discussion. The question is do faculty feel it is a reasonable workload connected to what they want students to learn? If not, they should talk about ways to own SLOs they care about doing the assessment on. RCC has asked the Senate twice to adopt a resolution to ask administration to exercise right of assignment not to schedule, but it hasn't passed.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- a. GE Work group – mentioned above.
- b. Prerequisite Training – mentioned above. Need to form an Ad Hoc Committee. The senate will designate annually the skilled faculty for English, Math and Reading. What goal we are trying to achieve with the prerequisite?
- c. IGETC and CSUGE as local patterns – mentioned above. All three colleges have approved.

- III. Open Hearing
- IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure
 - a. College Updates
 - i. Moreno Valley – Two new CTE Deans were at the meeting and Carolyn gave them the background on what the intent was for AP 4260, Limitations on Enrollments, Prerequisites, and Co-requisites. They would like to submit it for senate approval in the next year or so.
 - ii. Norco/District – Discussed AP 4260. The Electrician Apprentice Program was held up by an issue with CTA but the curriculum has now been submitted to the board committee for board approval. Brian reported on the conference he attended during spring break: Two TMCs have been developed for C-ID for areas of emphasis for 2015-2016 - Diversity Studies which is changing to Social Studies and Global Studies. Two more are being developed for 2016-2017. They have descriptors for EMS and Biotechnology and college faculty are also developing descriptors for Basic Skills courses because they are anticipating this is going to be important for common assessment for all community colleges. Model curriculum has been developed for Engineering, IT and Nursing; however, they don't meet the unit requirements for transfer. An agreement is being discussed with the universities where students would have an incentive to take these courses for transfer, eg., priority registration.

Also discussion took place regarding non-credit career development and college prep courses.

- iii. Riverside/State – What can be done to reduce the high number of SLOs in courses where the C-ID descriptor has 8, 10, or 15? Richard proposed contacting Hayley Ashby and suggesting five faculty, two from curriculum, two from assessment and Marc Sanchez to look into this issue and come back with a recommendation. Richard suggested moving some of the content out of the SLO box into the course content box might help. The committee voted last Tuesday to approve the waiver of GE additional degree requirements for students who already hold a regionally accredited Bachelor's Degree. This has been approved by the RCC senate and the District Senate. A motion was made to waive additional degree requirements for students who do the CSUGE or IGETC pattern, but not for students who do the 20 unit GE pattern.
State: The state has equalized funding for non-credit courses which are now funded at the full credit FTEs level. The higher funding rate requires that courses be in a program, but for non-credit, two courses that are linked is the minimum definition for program. Richard announced the new State Curriculum Chair.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- a. GE Work group – Meets on Monday.
- b. Prerequisite Training – Training will take place this summer. With the Title 5 change, content review now overrides statistical validation but it does not replace it. A cross discipline prerequisite can be added to a course using content review but statistics will still need to be looked at as part of that process. Initially, if statistics doesn't support a prerequisite, content review can be used to substantiate it. Title 5 states that they are allowing local districts to decide whether they want to continue using statistical validation and content review before the prerequisite is implemented or use only content review. But as a District, we agreed to have a tremendous amount of dialogue as part of content review. After two years, if statistics don't show that students are more successful, the course must be re-written or the prerequisite has to be removed. Sequential courses with non-cross disciplinary prerequisites are not exempt from content review.
- c. Baccalaureate exemption from GE requirements – All three colleges, all three Senates and District Senate have approved. The IGETC and CSUGE as local patterns were also approved.

A student can complete four programs, but they can only be awarded one degree.

- IV. Curriculum Policy & Procedure
 - a. College Updates
 - i. Moreno Valley – Carolyn reported a sad turn of events that one of their PT faculty, Manuel Cortez, was killed in an auto accident over spring break. Where will ADJ be since it will be split between BCTC and the Humanities, Arts and Social Science department? All the new Deans are in place and attend curriculum.
 - ii. Norco/District – Discussed the wording of AP 4260.

- iii. Riverside/State – Discussion ensued regarding a counselor’s request to waive the additional GE requirements for students who choose the IGETC or CSUGE patterns. The RCC curriculum committee felt that those five units are valuable and did not approve of waiving the additional graduation requirements. The RCC Dean stated that if classes are not going to be taught, then they should be removed from the catalog. All history CORs were updated last fall. Students now have a greater flexibility to meet the CSU requirement with a mix of courses. Greg Burchett is willing to be the next RCC chair. SB 440 requires colleges to develop degrees as areas of emphasis. The two that are going forward is a Global Studies and a Diversity Studies.

V. OLD BUSINESS

- a. GE Work group – Carolyn was elected Chair. For the next meeting they all agreed to meet by CCCconfer video conferencing so everyone can be heard and to reduce travel time. Their next meeting will be in fall and Hayley and Carolyn will collaborate on the minutes. They all agreed to review and align current courses with the Gen Ed SLOs and to review the GE program and guidelines. They also agreed to review the list of courses that had been developed and decide which courses should and should not be included. The prerequisite issue was discussed. Carolyn mentioned that new mapping needs to be done to the new GE SLOs. Need to create a form that will allow multiple course deletions and additions to the Gen Ed Program. - III. Curriculum Policy & Procedure
 - a. College Updates
 - i. Moreno Valley – Carolyn attended a presentation on a Canvas demo right before the curriculum meeting. MVC was quite impressed with its functionality and ease of use. Three curriculum representatives were selected for Math (James Namekata), Reading, and English (Edd Williams). They did a self-assessment in SurveyMonkey for the committee to respond to. Bob Fontaine invited them to have their April 26, 2016 meeting out at Ben Clark. They had a long discussion about the new math language. The biggest issue was that Title 5 requires faculty to use multiple measures of assessment and the committee felt that this issue needs to be addressed. MVC will have the same committee members for 2015-16. Also discussed the ADJ transfer degree which is currently assigned to the Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences department not to Ben Clark.
 - ii. Norco/District – Reviewed the TBA course content examples and had a discussion about what they felt should be included. Reviewed the math

language for the catalog as an information item. Brian mentioned the possible split in Art so that the committee is aware. At the District Senate meeting Brian was asked about the math placement exam and they insisted that the District Curriculum Committee should have been notified first. Their rationale was that placement has to do with assessment and assessment has to do with curriculum, but this is not a curriculum issue!

- iii. Riverside/State – Greg Burchett was elected the new RCC curriculum chair. The curriculum committee has several members that think a discussion about separating objectives and SLOs is a good thing. Richard feels it might be best to have them both in the CORs rather than somewhere else. **State:** Richard was at the State Senate office yesterday. Everyone knows that a degree must have at least 60 units, but now the State Chancellor’s office has been rejecting programs that exceed 60 units because staff now interpret 60 as both a floor and ceiling. Dr. Isaac announced at an RCC retreat last Friday that the UC’s are about to proclaim that ten TMCs don’t necessarily reflect the programs at CSU as negotiated.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

- a. AOE / GE revision timeline – Discussion ensued regarding the GE process. A suggestion was made to start the process in March so it is completed by the November due date and start on the AOE’s in September. Only one annual due date is needed for inclusion into the catalog. It was suggested that maybe they should consider waiting until the Gen Ed Workgroup makes their revisions to the GE requirements first before adding any courses, that way we know what the target is. A course should not be added unless the COR is current. **Discussion on criteria:** It appears that the intent was to create a GE program that would be a solid transfer program and one of the criteria was to make sure the course transferred to a Cal State or UC. Question regarding #3 on page 3 – “If the course is not transferrable, is the course aligned with any of the GE program learning outcomes?” Does a course have to be transferrable to be in our GE program? Two things they thought would result from the previous Gen Ed Workgroup: (1) shrink down the courses, and (2) have serious discussion about adding COM-1 or COM-9.
