Reports from Colleges

- 1. Moreno Valley
 - a. Ann Pfeifle will be reporting to the Board tonight regarding some curriculum topics, particularly related to Ethnic Studies and some of the other work that the faculty and the committees have done.

- 3. Riverside



- a. RCC's VPAA stepped down in the fall and Kristi DiMemmo has stepped in as the curriculum committee co-chair. Susan Mills is also the interim VPAA.
- b. Faculty are asking questions regarding how we're communicating to students about the Ethnic Studies change for the fall. Because the changes are due to catalog rights, the Ethnic Studies changes will not apply to past students, so there's less of a need for a communication push as there was with AB705, however, we will still need to ensure students are aware of the opportunities available to them.

Discussion Items

- 1. AOE Discussion Ann Pfeifle
 - a. Jeannie Kim Dr. Isaac has raised the question regarding whether the AOEs should be discontinued.
 - b. Ellen Brown-Drinkwater The ADTs are primarily for use with the CSU system, but there are many transfer majors for which the district does not have a program of study. For example, if a student intends to transfer into an engineering major to UC, they are placed in the Math and Science AOE for IGETC. The educational plan is then reviewed to ensure the proper major preparation work is done. Even if we have an ADT, if the CSU doesn't have an equivalent major, the ADT will not be accepted.
 - c. Jeanne Howard The main reason students are enrolled in an AOE is because we don't have the equivalent degree for them. We can't design a degree for every major at every CSU and UC that every student wants to go to. What do you do for a student who is a chemistry major and wants to attend UC? How do you direct that student so they save the most amount of time and money? You don't want the student to stay at the college for four years because they aren't completing the appropriate courses for their major. The AOE allows the student to obtain the units they need in an organized manner.
 - d. Jeannie Kim Dr. Isaac has stated there appears to be an issue with students in an AOE staying in the district and not moving on to transfer, which could also lead to an equity issue with space not being available for new students. Dr. Isaac has also expressed the desire to see which students use the AOEs versus the ADTs to ensure students aren't using the AOEs inappropriately.
 - e. Ann Pfeifle Is the district able to gather data for all three colleges?
 - i. Jeannie Kim Agreed to work with the IE team to collect the data. A study could be commissioned and information could be brought back. The expertise from the Articulation Officers may be needed.
 - ii. Jeanne Howard Agreed to add this topic to the next AO meeting for discussion.
 - f. Kelly Douglass We may also want the specific data to be clearly defined. If Dr.



Isaac is concerned about students being stuck, but the students are utilizing multiple degrees so they can stay, are they truly stuck in the system, or are they simply continuing to attend? What is the specific problem we're attempting to identify?

- g. Ellen Brown-Drinkwater Many students will qualify for a few AOEs and they may apply for all of them. What do we do with students who need to declare a major, but we don't offer a major for them?
- h. Ann Pfeifle Some questions may include how many students are doing this because there aren't other options. A community college may also be a place where students come to learn and return to in the future to continue their education. That may be critical in how we define success.
- i. Jeannie Kim If the community colleges are expected to be the first two years of an undergraduate degree, the role of the colleges may be changing.
- j. Kelly Douglass A concern may be how the information from the study will be used, who is using the data, and the options that are then presented.
- k. Jeannie Kim Having the three AOs pose the questions that we need to be asking will help ensure we are pulling the correct information. The information can then be brought to this group for review, which may lead to additional questions.
- 2. Equitable Placement (AB 705) ESL Adoption Plan Submission (Info Item) Jeannie Kim
 - a. Jeannie Kim shared the ESL Adoption Plan that will need to be submitted to the State Chancellor's Office in June. No works has been performed yet, but a work group will be established.
 - b. Kelly Douglass When this work was done for AB705, the disciplines worked under the guidance of their CIOs to perform the submission. This work may not be the responsibility of the curriculum committee.
