Reports from Colleges

- 1. Moreno Valley
 - a. The Moreno Valley curriculum committee was notified regarding the itemized general education plan. At this time, the faculty have not had many questions.
 - b. At District Academic Senate, Ann Pfeifle reported a variety of information regarding curriculum, including important upcoming curriculum dates, additional information on DE Addenda, and that course numbering guidelines are being solidified. Concerns were also raised regarding the new ERP. Both Chris Blackmore and the Chancellor assuaged some fears and indicated that curriculum needs to be academically centered and that the new system will work.



c. Additionally, the topic of local DE approval was also discussed. The District Academic Senate did not find reasonable justification at this time to change our policy, which is that the colleges attempt to find consensus, but if not possible the 'majority rules' with one vote per college. Faculty are encouraged to voice any concerns that they have, but in addition must also provide data and evidence for the reason for any change. At this point in time, the senate presidents did not feel the faculty had done that.

2. Norco

- a. The Norco curriculum committee was given the GE update form with the request to have each discipline review the courses to decide if each course is appropriate. The Norco Senate was also informed about this process and made the suggestion that once the list is finalized that clear information regarding credit for prior learning be included in the same area as the GE information. At this point, the credit for prior learning information is in a separate area in the catalog.
- b. Additionally, there appear to be two different names listed in the catalog for the EAR discipline. The GE section mention one, but not the other.

3. Riverside

- a. The GE cleanup project was also discussed at the curriculum meeting, and the senate asked if department chairs would also be receiving the information. Information about the project was forwarded.
- b. A question was raised about the location of GEG 1L in the itemized list. In the Natural Sciences area, GEG 1, 1H, and 5 are specifically listed as options, but not 1L. In the Social and Behavioral Sciences area, the catalog indicates any course for GEG is accepted other than the courses listed in Natural Sciences.
- c. Jay Boshara reached out to his predecessor, who indicated that GEG 1L was in the 2016 catalog, but upon review of the 2016 catalog GEG 1L did not appear to be listed.
 - i. Ann Pfeifle GEG 1L appears in Natural Sciences on the advising sheets used by counseling. Perhaps when the colleges split or when there were changes to Education Services there was an error.
 - ii. Bryan Nicol In Colleague, GEG 1L is listed in the Natural Sciences requirement at least as far back as 2007. In Social Behavioral Sciences, GEG 1L is specifically listed as not being accepted towards the requirement.
 - iii. Jeanne Howard The impact on students is probably minimal, as the Natural Sciences requires three units. The students would receive credit for 1L, but would need to take another class anyway due to 1L's unit value
- d. The history for GEG 1L seemed appropriate to ensure it is listed in the Natural Sciences area and not in the Social and Behavioral Sciences area.
- e. A similar question was raised regarding ANT 1L, however, there does not appear to be sufficient information to indicate where it should be included in the general education pattern. The ANT discipline should propose 1L for inclusion if they deem it appropriate.



- f. At the Riverside Curriculum Committee meeting, the Assessment Committee also provided a report, and there was a discussion regarding what happens when the committee believes there is a need to modify the GE SLOs. Where does this process start? How is it done?
- g. The Assessment representatives indicated that while they assess the SLOs, the process of changing them is outside of their purview, and after discussion it was suggested that District Academic Standards is where the process should begin.
- h. The ENG discipline at Riverside also created a Community of Practice. In one of their sessions, they commented on the 4th GE SLO, which refers to the term "citizenship" in its language. One thought was that this GE SLO could be more intentional in its language use, given that the term "citizenship" can be interpreted in a variety of ways.
- i. Where are the Norco and Moreno Valley assessment committees in their review process at this time?
 - i. Ann Pfeifle Not sure where the committee is in their process, but Academic Standards appears to be the appropriate place for this topic.
 - ii. Brian Johnson The assessment committee does not provide reports to the curriculum committee, so unsure where the committee is with their review process at this time.
- j. Jeannie Kim There is also an assembly bill in progress that could lead to an Ethnic Studies requirement at the Associate Degree level, which may also impact this conversation. Dr. Isaac raised the question about any work taking place regarding the call to action. Dr. Kim indicated the work taking place in the committees and Dr. Isaac commended the group for their work.

Action Items

1. Curriculum Proposals

Discussion Items

- 1. Brown Act and Governor's Executive Order Jeannie Kim
 - a. The committees will need to continue to abide by the Brown Act. The Board of Trustees will be meeting in both May and June in person, but accommodations have been made for online Zoom opportunities to be available. As long as there is any level of restriction, Zoom will continue to be an option, but there will need to be the availability of a public component as well.
 - b. Kelly Douglass Does this mean chairs need to be present, but faculty can attend via Zoom?
 - i. Jeannie Kim The committee members will need to be present, but the public also needs the option to attend in person as well, however, Zoom will continue to be an option for attendees.
 - c. Kelly Douglass The college committee members should also plan to be in person?
 - i. Jeannie Kim Yes. The voting members need to be present, but we can



make accommodations for other faculty members.

- d. Ann Pfeifle If a committee member is on special accommodations due to COVID, can that member be accommodated?
 - i. Jeannie Kim Yes, we would need to provide the same accommodation for the committee members.
- 2. COR Review with Equity Questions Kelly Douglass
 - a. By the end of the term, Kelly Douglass would like to have a first draft of a COR Review information sheet with information pulled from the RCCD Handbook, which would include information about the requirements for proposals, but along with asking about culturally responsive pedagogy as well.
 - b. If there is any feedback, please provide that information by the end of the week.
 - c. Additionally, the Community of Practice this year is reading the book <u>From Equity Talk to Equity Walk</u>, which has specific information about curriculum and what can be done with GE SLOs to reflect the equity values.
 - d. Ann Pfeifle Met with a faculty member this week who expressed the concern that the information provided needs to be clear and that professional development will be needed as well. Faculty will need the proper resources to take up any recommendations. Additionally, the faculty experts must have a say in this process and how things are measured.
 - e. Kelly Douglass Also spoke with a faculty member who indicated that it is not helpful to simply put information on the to COR and to make faculty feel as though they must teach something they are culturally unprepared to teach. This can also be harmful. Additionally, Brian Johnson raised a point at the beginning of this conversation that has also been important to keep in mind that a course would not be rejected based on any equity recommendations, but that the checklist could still serve as a guide of things to consider. For professional development, there will be a need to partner with administrators and the senate.
 - f. Ann Pfeifle There are faculty who are concerned about losing their jobs because of these recommendations, or because they do not have the proper tools. The discipline members are discipline experts, not equity experts.
 - g. Jeannie Kim There is a concerted effort from all parties to make sure that professional development is available to the faculty. The faculty should not feel threatened, but rather the hope is that they feel empowered. It is the administration's responsibility to ensure the faculty members have the proper tools available to them, and the administration is committed to that. Some of these components may reside with HRER or the Academic Senates, but the pedagogical approach lives with the faculty members. We will also need to ensure the part-time faculty have the tools to teach effectively as well. We will collaborate to ensure all these systems are in place.
 - h. Kelly Douglass A first draft will be available at the end of the term, that can then be taken to the colleges and to the senates for further discussion.
