## **Discussion Items**

- 1. Material Fees Kelly Douglass
  - a. Riverside has a wine course with material fees that seemed somewhat arbitrary. The fees are listed in the proposal in Meta, but not in a field that prints to the COR.
  - b. Brian Johnson Normally, don't we list fees in the course description?
  - c. Kelly Douglass Yes, although in the past we have discussed not stating a specific amount as the amount may change over time. We still need to notify students that there is a material fee so students are aware when they go to register. We need to decide on uniform language on the COR for when there is a material fee, and the amount should be justified.
  - d. Casandra Greene When the course was modified, the fee was removed from the description, and placed instead on the course fees field, which does not print to the COR.
  - e. Brian Johnson The cost should be listed in the description. If there is a course with a fee, students should know how much it is going to cost. It may change year to year, but then we have to go in and change it.
  - f. Ann Pfeifle We've also discussed how material fees apply for courses, like culinary, where students are required to have knives. The cost of knives can be very different depending on where they are purchased.
  - g. Kelly Douglass There is Title 5 language about materials fees and there are some very strict rules. There is a set of rules for when students can obtain the materials themselves, and another set of rules for when they cannot. While reading through the language, you can charge a fee if there is a legal or safety issue, which may be why it would apply to this course. You can't ask student to buy an entire bottle of wine when they are only sipping a small amount. There should be a checklist for course materials that ensures the course fulfills the requirement.
  - h. Casandra Greene For this course, faculty indicated a justification that faculty will need to purchase the wine.
  - i. Kelly Douglass Will attempt to get all of the language and bring it forward along with a template of suggestions.
  - j. Sabina Fernandez At Ben Clark, there is language for some courses indicating a specific cost along with a comment stating that the cost may change.
  - k. Casandra Greene KIN 30 states there is a fee that will not be covered by California Promise Grant. There's another KIN course that has a statement about the BOG waiver, which no longer exists.



## 2. AB 1111 – Kelly Douglass

- a. AB 1111 is the common course numbering law that passed in October 2021. A senate officer wanted to begin discussing a plan to address the changes. However, the state will indicate what we need to do and we still don't know what the template for the numbering is going to be or what the process will be.
- b. Ann Pfeifle Because we are not changing courses or content, there is no need for a vote. The process would be under our purview due to local control.
- c. Casandra Greene All degrees and certificates will also need to be updated and submitted to the state.
- d. Kelly Douglass The updates may be clerical, however, one area of concern will be if a course is renumbered to a course number already in use at RCCD. What do we do with that second course?
- e. Ann Pfeifle Faculty will need to be notified, but how we present this process will be important. This doesn't need to be a big deal, as we are changing the numbers we are mandated by the state to change.
- f. Nick Franco What about courses with the same CID descriptor?
- g. Bryan Nicol In one of the updates from the Sate Chancellor's Office, they said this was one of the issues they were aware of.
- h. Bryan Nicol Recommends pushing modifications through Meta directly to Active in order to maintain the history of the course data. Bryan is happy to perform the work to do so.
