Reports from Colleges

- 1. Moreno Valley
 - a. Moreno Valley continues to hold a local technical review to assist faculty with proposals. The group is also looking at ADTs that the college could potentially offer, including a possible MOU with a sister college or UCR to offer certain sciences that require a lab.
 - b. The Moreno Valley Academic Senate is developing a new process to help prepare faculty for leadership roles in the Academic Senate and College Curriculum Committee.
- 2. Norco
 - a. No report.



3. Riverside

- a. At the previous College Curriculum meeting, Senior Academic Evaluations Specialist Jeanine Gardner asked about courses that have not been under rotation but are necessary to complete degrees and certificates.
 - i. Ann Pfeifle Moreno Valley has worked on a similar sunset plan for courses that have not been offered.
 - ii. Casandra Greene VPAA Lynn Wright has requested a report of courses that identify a three-year rotation, and which term the courses were last offered. Mia Timme has been drafting the information, and the report will be taken to a Department Leadership meeting.
 - iii. Ellen Brown-Drinkwater Counseling is also preparing a list of students who have been unable to complete their program due to courses being canceled.

Action Items

1. Curriculum Proposals

Discussion Items

- 1. Interdisciplinary Disciplines Kelly Douglass
 - a. There has been a lingering concern regarding the existing disciplines that align with the interdisciplinary studies minimum qualification, specifically MIL and SJS, as none of the constituent disciplines have been defined.
 - b. For Military Science (MIL), there is an existing Military Science minimum qualification in the handbook that the discipline must align with. The qualification is any degree plus work experience at a military pay grade of E7 or above. However, the district can create a more advanced qualification of desired.
 - c. **Question:** Who decides if we should supersede the qualifications? Or, should the discipline be deleted?
 - i. Ann Pfeifle HIS faculty have only ever taught the course via the HIS cross listing.
 - ii. The Academic Senate and HIS discipline should review. May also want to verify with the Veterans Center and Counseling if any students are being specifically routed to the MIL discipline.
 - d. For Social Justice Studies (SJS), the interdisciplinary studies minimum qualification requires a master's degree in the named field, or a master's degree in a constituent field with course work in another field. The term "course work" as used in the handbook is not clearly defined.
 - e. Question: What are the constituent fields? Who determines what those fields are?
 - i. Kelly Douglass will take to the Senate for feedback.
 - f. **Question:** Should the constituent fields be decided on a course-by-course basis within the discipline, or for the discipline as a whole?
 - i. While the committee agreed that deciding on a course-by-course basis makes sense, it is unclear who formally should decide this. The question will be brought to Senate.
