Rationale: This degree is historically important in that it was the first arts degree developed at MVC. However, it has not been

modified since its creation and is no longer relevant with regard to our students' transfer needs. This program modification will exclude courses no longer being offered at MVC and adopt 2 new additions to the college catalog (MUS-101 and MUS-P52A). The structure of this program will be redesigned with an emphasis on the 3 main categories (Theory/Applied Music/Ensemble) requisite for transfer to CSU and UC programs. This will more closely align the AA degree with the currently proposed ADT program modifications and simplify navigation of the music degrees for both students and counselors. Although these two degrees (AA and ADT) will be similar in curricular content, the AA will provide the benefit of allowing for a higher total unit count, thus allowing music students to

pursue an even more rigorous program of study than is currently possible in the ADT.

Rationale:

(Please note: This information will be presented to the Board of Trustees.)

This degree is historically important in that it was the first arts degree developed at MVC. However, it has not been modified since its creation and is no longer relevant with regard to our students' transfer needs. This program modification will exclude courses no longer being offered at MVC and adopt 2 new additions to the college catalog (MUS-101 and MUS-P52A). The structure of this program will be redesigned with an emphasis on the 3 main categories (Theory/Applied Music/Ensemble) requisite for transfer to CSU and UC programs. This will more closely align the AA degree with the currently proposed ADT program modifications and simplify navigation of the music degrees for both students and counselors. Although these two degrees (AA and ADT) will be similar in curricular content, the AA will provide the benefit of allowing for a higher total unit count, thus allowing music students to pursue an even more rigorous program of study than is currently possible in the ADT.

The Associate of Arts in Music from Moreno Valley College is designed as a rigorous program of study with attention to the core components (theory, aural and keyboard skills) necessary for transfer success into Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Music programs at both CSU and UC schools. Additionally, it provides accessibility to all prospective music majors through allowing students to choose elective pathways aligned with their particular area of interest including: musicology, theory, music technology and performance. Completion of this curriculum will demonstrate commitment to the serious study of music in practice and in theory and provide comprehensive preparation for upper-division work.

As an educational institution, MVC traces its origins back to its start as a satellite campus of RCC with a focus on its CTE programs and a special emphasis on Health Sciences and Public Safety. However, since becoming an accredited institution in 2010, the school has recognized and embraced the importance of becoming a fully comprehensive college. Because Moreno Valley is generally recognized as an underserved city, it is all the more essential that students from the local community be presented with the same types of educational opportunities as more affluent communities. So, while the music program (as part of the School of Visual and Performing Arts) is relatively small in comparison with other programs at the school, it adds to the essential diversity of educational opportunities available to students through the school at large.

In summary, the AA degree in music fulfills the mission of the college and serves the needs of the local community through providing students with equitable access to a degree which will empower them to succeed as music majors at four year institutions and ultimately realize their professional goals.
