1. Curriculum Proposals

Reports from Colleges

- 1. Moreno Valley
 - a. Nothing to report.



2. Norco

a. Mentioned that AB1111 is being discussed by the curriculum committees and developing a plan for implementation.

3. Riverside

- a. Question was raised regarding a district discipline discussion to clarify that each college is considered one vote. This is what Kelly confirmed. The committee agreed.
- b. CALGETC was discussed, which goes into effect for 25-26. Unsure that there is anything that the AOs can tell faculty to prepare. There is concern regarding the Lifelong Learning area. If there is any information or guidance that can be shared with faculty, please bring to the committee.
- c. ESL faculty at Riverside would like to create an ESL course with California School for the Deaf. They have a template from another college with a similar class and are looking at reviewing ESL-46. They would like to create a California School for the Deaf course that is taught by an instructor that signs for students who are learning English as a Second Language, but whose primary language is American Sign Language.
- d. They could create a new course, or they could dedicate sections to students at the School for the Deaf. However, the COR states that it should teach oral expression. There is also a section on emerging oral language skills. Can ESL-46 be taught if the COR specifically refers to oral expression?
 - i. Casandra Greene ESL-46 also states the intent is to move students through the ESL-46 to 50 series.
 - ii. Kelly Douglass If the intent is not to move students through the series, then it should be a new course. If that's not the case and the intent is to have students move through the series, what happens?
 - iii. Ann Pfeifle Mt. SAC also offers sections dedicated to deaf students. There may be an ADA rule that would allow for ESL-46 to be offered.
 - iv. Casandra Greene The COR also states the course will be taught in English.
 - v. Ann Pfeifle The PCAH also allows for a course to be taught in any language. If you had a student with a physical disability in a KIN course, a reasonable adaptation would be made.
 - vi. Kelly Douglass May need to learn more about the teaching modality and what the teaching space looks like. Also, is there a way to look up other college's public course outlines of record?
- e. Lecture and Lab Courses A question was raised at a previous meeting regarding GEO-32 and whether this had been replaced by another GEO series. This is not the case and GEO-32 is a course that is in use. For BIO-15, Kelly will follow up with faculty.



Discussion Items

- 1. §55003 on Prerequisites and Local Validation Process Kelly Douglass
 - a. https://www.law.cornell.edu/regulations/california/5-CCR-55003
 - b. Title 5 Section 55003 has language that discusses prerequisites. Area 1B in CALGETC is likely to follow the UC rules, which will require that the courses approved have an ENG-1A prerequisite. This will ultimately narrow down the approved courses to potentially only ENG-1B. For ALR-4, the course can be rewritten with the prerequisite, but the question is how does the prerequisite need to be validated. Does it need to go through content validation or is it allowable because it is required by the four-year universities?
 - c. This section has been updated with the following language:
 - i. "(d)(1) the prerequisite or corequisite is expressly required or expressly authorized by statute or regulation, or expressly required by institutions for which the college has transfer agreements; or"
 - ii. ALR-4 transfer to the four-year universities without the prerequisite.
 - iii. Part E of the section also has language regarding prerequisites.
 - d. Kelly Douglass spoke with District Counsel Keith Dobyns, who arrived at the conclusion that 'required by a four-year institution' does not indicate required to meet a specific area. District Counsel did state that if guidance from the State Chancellor's Office states it is permissible, that may be appropriate.
 - e. However, CALGETC and AB928 are not the law currently, so if they want to add the prerequisite, it appears the discipline must do content review.
 - f. Questions: If there is something in this language that would allow for not performing content review, please advise. Additionally, who at the state Academic Senate and Curriculum Committees can be contacted?
 - i. Ann Pfeifle They are generally responsive. May also want to e-mail the curriculum chair listsery.
 - g. Nick Franco When looking at Title 5, it seems pretty clear that the language "required for a four-year university," does not say specifically what the university requirement is. Could make the case for prerequisites on almost any course that they won't meet the specific requirement for certain areas, but the course will still transfer. We may also add prerequisites because it is required by a specific campus.
 - i. Kelly Douglass Section D of the Title 5 section does specifically deal with articulation agreements and C-ID.
 - ii. Nick Franco Transfer agreement can be a very broad term. It could refer to the entire articulation agreement with the system.
 - h. Jeanne Howard Our GE patterns should be considered transfer agreements between our schools and the four-year colleges. IGETC, which is a transfer agreement, requires certain prerequisites if a course is to fit into a certain area. If the discipline is required to perform content review, how is this done? We need to be able to advise faculty on this issue? If we have to perform content review, we will likely have to review all courses that have prerequisites with ENG and MAT.
 - i. Kelly Douglass The idea that the GE pattern is the transfer agreement is helpful



- language. Will continue to look into this. Want to ensure we are approaching this in the right way.
- j. Brian Johnson If the prerequisite is added, a large amount of content is going to have to be added to the course. Content review may be appropriate for this specific course.
- k. This topic will be agendized for next meeting.
