Reports from Colleges

- 1. Moreno Valley
 - a. The first curriculum meeting of the year included the new VPAA as well as the first official meeting with Deanna Murrell as the Moreno Valley Articulation Officer.
 - b. Nick Sinigaglia provided a report to Senate regarding the continuing discussion on the GE updates.



2. Norco

a. The committee discussed revisions to GE and the timeline. Questions were raised regarding the process and timeline for updating programs impacted by PSY/SOC-48.

3. Riverside

a. The committee discussed proposals for GE and PSY/SOC-48 impacts. This topic should be discussed at the next meeting.

Action Items

1. Curriculum Proposals

Discussion Items and Public Comment

- 1. Credit for Prior Learning and Pass/No Pass Grading
 - a. Sam Lee Question at hand is what to do about P/NP with CPL. In order for students to use a P/NP option it has to be indicated on the COR.
 - i. Option 1 Base CPL awarding on whether P/NP is on the COR. Faculty should review any course and add P/NP if CPL should be awarded. Students could choose to take the actual course on a P/NP basis, which could impact transferability. Students may not understand the ramifications of doing so. Courses without P/NP would require faculty to assign a grade for CPL, which could impact GPA.
 - ii. Option 2 An update to the BP/AP to allow for P/NP for credit for prior learning for any course approved for CPL.
 - b. Kelly Douglass Systemwide Guidance from 2020 makes reference to Title 5, Sections 55050 (f) and (g). CPL should be clearly annotated as credit for prior learning and grading should be according to the regular grading system approved by the governing board. We may not be able to resolve this with a BP because if the discipline has not agreed that P/NP is an option for the course then the BP would be superseding the will of the discipline and potentially violating Title 5. If P/NP is not available, students would need to submit a portfolio or equivalent to the discipline for review and the assigning of a grade. Students should be advised of the recommended credit award and be allowed to accept or deny it.
 - c. Steven Schmidt Subsection G appears to state that the P/NP is the exception, not the rule. The grading system for that course is the rule.
 - d. Kimberly Bell CPL is not awarded without discipline approval, so with an updated BP/AP, the discipline still would approve whether CPL is appropriate and then use P/NP as an option for grading. We do not post to the transcript until there is an interactive process ensuring students' goals align with what is appropriate for CPL and depending on their transfer institution.
 - e. Deanna Murrell Has the impact on financial aid been considered?
 - i. Sam Lee Discussions on satisfactory academic progress and CPL's role have taken place. The concern is both max credits and pace of progress.
 - f. Jo Scott-Coe If the discipline has agreed CPL is an option but there is no P/NP on the COR, where does the messaging about the P/NP possibility live? Is it only in the policy?
 - i. Sam Lee A list of articulation agreements for all courses is maintained. Generally, when students are interested in CPL they are not looking in the catalog. They come into the office and present documentation.



- ii. Jo Scott-Coe If the discipline has approved CPL, but they don't want P/NP to be on the COR, can the P/NP option live on another document?
- iii. Ann Pfeifle No.
- g. Ann Pfeifle In terms of curriculum, there is no blanket option from our reading of Title 5.
 - i. Kelly Douglass Section G states that P/NP shall be offered if that option is ordinarily available for the course, so an update to the BP is not something ordinary for the course.
 - ii. Sam Lee "Ordinarily available" could be satisfied with the AP for grading based on the statement. That would cover it.
- h. Steven Schmidt We have instances with Music Theory where students have taken the AP exam or have taken a private course. Music faculty perform diagnostic testing and then assign a letter grade. In order to be equitable with other students who are taking the course, it is important that students receive a grade.
- i. Kelly Douglass At the curriculum regional meeting, CPL was discussed. They emphasized that faculty award the grade for prior learning or not, that there is a large amount of data that must be reported, and that CPL is understood as separate from AP, IB, and credit by exam. CPL is a different but related category. Additionally, AP credit is also decided by the disciplines.
 - i. Sam Lee AP has additional regulations, but it is still CPL.
 - ii. Janelle Brekke AP credit is posted to transcripts currently with P/NP, but those courses don't have P/NP as an option in every instance.
 - iii. Ann Pfeifle How does this appear on the transcript?
 - iv. Janelle Brekke Evaluators post credit and input a P.
 - v. Kelly Douglass The student is receiving credit, but not a grade.
 - vi. Sam Lee That's what CPL is.
 - vii. Kimberly Bell Can we transcribe CPL and AP so it is specifically credit?
 - viii. Ann Pfeifle If AP, IB, and CLEP are able to be transcribed as credit, then we should pursue something similar for CPL.
 - ix. Kelly Douglass For AP credit, credit is shown as having taken an alternative version of the class.
 - x. Sam Lee We may only be talking about P/NP because it's mentioned in Title 5, but we only transcribe it as credit. Perhaps we can use CR with a CPL indication.
 - xi. Kelly Douglass We had to rewrite the grading system BP to match Title 5 language around grades. Is the intent to say students should have grades for CPL, or that they just receive credit?
 - xii. Sam Lee Colleges have authority to give credit.
- j. The committee further discussed the possibility of transcribing CPL as only displaying credit instead of displaying a grade, but students who present a portfolio or petition for credit by exam could potentially receive a grade.

Pass No Pass Option for AP 4235 (General) Credit for Prior Learning RCCD BP/AP 2235:

The requirement for a pass-no pass option for CPL comes from <u>Title 5 55050(g)</u>, "Grading shall be according to the regular grading system approved by the governing board pursuant to section <u>55023</u>, except that students shall be offered a "pass-no pass" option if that option is ordinarily available for the course."

Except for Credit by Exam and Portfolio Review, Pass/No Pass grades should be used for CPL for the following reasons:

- 1. CPL is granted in recognition of prior learning and is not earned in a specific term; it may be awarded at any time and is generally recorded on the transcript with no term reference.
- CPL is granted for prior learning that may be the same or "similar to" a college course. As such, there is generally not enough information to justify a letter grade.
- 3. Awarding a letter grade for CPL can negatively impact the GPA and impact admission or transfer status.

Issue:

- Pass No Pass option is determined for each course in the catalog.
- Whereas faculty may wish to approve CPL for a course that does not have a Pass No Pass option, they may not wish to add a Pass No Pass option for *all* students.

Consideration:

- For courses that should not offer Pass No Pass for CPL, faculty should not approve articulation requests for CPL.
- Adding a Pass No Pass option to a course can negatively impact students who
 elect to take a course P/NP and then decide to transfer to a UC or private
 university. UC has a 14 units limit on P/NP.



Equity:

 Providing CPL students with the ability to receive credit towards degree completion.

MAP Housing courses/curriculum denied:

 MAP can house courses that have been denied by district faculty for documentation.



Possible Solution

Revise AP 4235 Grading Policy to:

- Grading shall be according to the regular grading system in accordance with Administrative Procedure AP X230 Grading and Academic Record Symbols;
- For Credit by Exam and Portfolio Review, students shall be offered a "Pass/No Pass" option, in accordance with Administrative Procedure AP X230 Pass/No Pass Grading Option, if that option is ordinarily available for the course.
- For all other types of CPL, students shall be eligible for a "Pass/No Pass" grade.

And add this Blanket Statement to AP 4230:

"All courses are eligible for the P/NP option for CPL purposes."
