### **Agenda and Minutes**

  - a. Steven Schmidt has forwarded the most recent version of the handbook to the committee.
  - b. Kelly Douglass In the DE section in part one, there is a phrase on page 41 that states "...in which face-to-face is halted." Can this be changed to "in which on site instruction is halted all or in part."
    - i. Committee agreed.



- c. Kelly Douglass On the experimental courses check list, "State transfer type" should be removed as it is non-applicable.
- d. Steven Schmidt Once approved, handbook should be brought to the college curriculum committee as an information item.
  - i. Brian Johnson Handbook was also previously taken to the Senate as an action item.
- e. Approved, Unanimous

#### **Discussion Items**

- 1. Activity Courses Kelly Douglass
  - a. Kelly Douglass has reached out to DAN faculty and their dean to discuss activity courses versus lab courses with homework hours but has not yet heard back. If faculty decide they are interested in pursuing this avenue, where should the discussion be taken next? The union, the senate, or both at the same time?
  - b. Steven Schmidt Has not found another community college that offers activity courses.
    - i. Bryan stated he would reach out on the coordinator list serv to see if any curriculum specialists have activity courses at their colleges.
  - c. This item will continue to remain as a discussion item on future Tech Review agendas
- 2. Discipline Coordinator Role in Curricunet Kelly Douglass
  - a. At the previous Riverside Curriculum Committee meeting, a representative and counterpart at senate raised an issue regarding the District Discipline Facilitator role. In the curriculum context, there is a facilitator role that is district wide that is not compensated or recognized in the contract, but exists in curriculum as a position in Meta that needs to approve proposals as a part of the process. For some disciplines, the facilitator is the senior most discipline member. For other disciplines, the position rotates from faculty member to faculty member.
  - b. This role regularly involves coordination and vote gathering, and the question was raised if there is any guidance that could be provided regarding how disciplines should decide who fulfills the role. However, one concern is that the Tech Review committee can't instruct disciplines on how to assign roles.
  - c. Ann Pfeifle The discipline facilitator is someone who oversees what the colleges are doing in that discipline and ensures there is discussion, but we have witnessed that this doesn't always happen. At Tech Review, minutes are used as proof of voting. Since Tech Review oversees this anyway, perhaps the facilitator role can be done away with and we can make it clear that unless correct documentation is attached to the proposal, their proposals will not move forward.
  - d. Kelly Douglass There appears to be a need for Tech Review to agree that this is a discipline decision, but someone is needed in Meta to approve proposals. Approving the proposals in Meta is an indication that there has been discipline coordination of some kind. If the discipline does not decide on a facilitator, curriculum will get stuck.
  - e. Jeannie Kim Is the role defined in the handbook?



- i. Brian Johnson The role is defined, but specific guidance is not necessarily given on how to choose a facilitator.
- f. Steven Schmidt –Tech Review perhaps could not make any decisions on how to assign a facilitator. The role itself is extremely important and needed to help manage shared curriculum.
- 3. Proposal Forms Bryan Nicol
  - a. Bryan will schedule a meeting specifically to review proposal forms and will invite the coordinators, AOs, and chairs. Anyone who is able to attend to provide feedback would be greatly appreciated.
- 4. Course Numbering Guidelines Bryan Nicol
  - a. What kind of course numbering guidelines are needed for the district, if any? What kind of policies surrounding numbering does the committee think need to be enacted, if any? Currently we have been restricting course numbers to 1-99 for credit courses and within the 800s for non-credit.
  - b. One potential concern is that disciplines like CIS will run out of available numbers if they are restricted to 1-99.
  - c. Bryan will review the current course numbering system for any patterns and will bring that information back to the next Tech Review.
