Action Items

- 1. Curriculum Proposals
 - a. Social Justice Studies Discussion
 - i. Ann Pfeifle In working with the faculty, it was found that there is no Social Justice Studies discipline in the minimum qualifications handbook. There also did not appear to be any additional information from Plenary.
 - ii. Brian Johnson Other colleges appear to house this discipline under "Interdisciplinary Studies."
 - iii. Lisa Nelson Reached out to sister colleges that offer Social Justice Studies to find out about how faculty FSAs are determined, but has not yet received a response. In doing research on the existing courses that are



- offered by sister colleges, Social Justice Studies appears to live in the Interdisciplinary Studies area.
- iv. Ann Pfeifle Offered to reach out to the RCCD Area Dean to see if more guidance can be provided.
- v. Ann Pfeifle and Kelly Douglass offered to announce at their committee meeting that the new discipline has been proposed and that faculty should consider obtaining the FSA.
- vi. Brian Johnson In looking at the C-ID for SJS 110, found that approved courses are under SOC, ETS, ENG, and other disciplines. For our district, who is qualified to teach SJS 110 if the minimum qualification is Interdisciplinary Studies?
 - 1. Kelly Douglass Based on what we are currently moving forward with, the faculty would need to have an FSA in Interdisciplinary Studies. If the COR is cross-disciplined with another discipline, then that faculty could teach the course as well.
 - 2. Jessica Cobb Faculty are not interested in cross-disciplining the course at this time.
- vii. Brian Johnson However, the minimum qualifications does not specify the actual qualification. Is it up to the college to determine the areas that apply? How can a college decide that SOC faculty can teach the course?
 - 1. Lisa Nelson This was the initial issue that came up when developing the course and launching it originally as an ENG course. The response from faculty was that perhaps not all ENG faculty would be able to teach the Into to Social Justice Studies course. This may be the reason that we would like to avoid cross-listing the course.
 - 2. Steven Schmidt It may also be a college decision so that we can limit who can teach the course to the people who have the most appropriate FSA.
- viii. Brian Johnson Based on the wording in the handbook, it seems that each college can decide which discipline is qualified to teach the course.
 - 1. Ann Pfeifle Yes, and there is a note that indicates that Interdisciplinary Studies is provided to allow for those cases where it is locally determined that a course must be taught by someone with qualifications that exceed a single discipline. The constituent disciplines may include any discipline found in the master list.
 - 2. Jessica Cobb We may want to look at the C-ID list. There is a list of courses that articulate to the CSU, and that list may be what HR uses to determine who is qualified to teach the course.
 - 3. Kelly Douglass We may need to obtain a list of what those disciplines are so that we can appropriately explain it.

 Additionally, what does the handbook mean where it states "allows for those places where it's locally determined that a course must be taught by someone with qualifications that exceed a single



- discipline?" Or, what are the "interdisciplinary areas?" Who determines this? Is it HR, or is it faculty?
- 4. Ann Pfeifle This may be HR's role.
- 5. Kelly Douglass How does HR interpret this, and what are the disciplines in the area?
- ix. Steven Schmidt Found the following link from ASCCC titled "Understanding Interdisciplinary Studies":

- 1. The link indicates that both hiring and curriculum committees are tasked with identifying the disciplines.
- 2. Kelly Douglass The example given in the link indicates a course that has been identified as interdisciplinary, and the disciplines associated with it. It then states that qualified faculty will have a master's degree in one of the disciplines listed and upper division or graduate level coursework in at least one other. It appears, then that this must be noted on the COR, so what are the multiple disciplines for SJS, and would this allow faculty to teach any interdisciplinary course?
- x. **Recommendation:** Invite the appropriate representative from HR to further discuss this at the next DCC meeting.

Discussion Items

- 1. Meta Bryan Nicol
 - a. Program Module
 - i. In the current program module, enrollment and completer projections are specified on a course-by-course basis in the Course Requirements section of the system. Is this the ideal way to handle it, or would it be better for faculty to have a single text box where they enter in the information?
 - 1. Ann Pfeifle Because faculty may not have direct access to that information, a textbox may be better.
 - 2. Kelly Douglass Textbox may be easier for faculty to use. A textbox would allow for faculty to copy and paste and would potentially make it so there is less of a need to perform clean up.
 - ii. Steven Schmidt Would it be helpful to have this information separated out for some sort of report?
 - 1. Bryan Nicol Up to this point, there has not been a need for that type of information. If faculty wanted to perform a study, perhaps it would be helpful, but the same information would be available in the textbox.
 - 2. Steven Schmidt If a study were performed, it may also be more likely to be based on actual completions rather than projected.
 - iii. Bryan will move forward with asking Meta to implement a textbox rather than course specific fields.



- iv. Additionally, the current module asks for data regarding adequacy of resources. The coordinators were not sure if this was needed outside of program review, and therefore, if it was needed at all in the program module in Meta.
 - 1. Kelly Douglass This is a step in the program process, but it is a step that involves the faculty members working with deans and administrators.
 - 2. Casandra Greene Perhaps a check box to indicate "Did you go through your college's program review process?"
 - 3. Steven Schmidt The specific data points may also be useful to have.
 - 4. Ann Pfeifle Requested the fields default to a 0 value.
- v. Coordinators are meeting with Meta on Thursday to request updates to the module with the goal of being able to demo the programs to the committee by the last curriculum committee meeting on June 1.
