Discussion Items

- 1. Addendum Criteria Kelly Douglass
 - a. Based on the document that the committee edited at the December Tech Review meeting, the following items are eligible for the addendum. Previous memos indicated that addenda should be posted at most once per month. The draft memo from 2020 will be brought back to Tech Review for review at the next meeting.
 - b. Items eligible for the addendum:
 - New Courses, Course Inclusions, New Programs, elective additions to existing
 programs, courses and programs that require changes due to statute or regulation,
 emergency clerical errors, articulation updates such as transferability or
 CSUGE/IGETC changes.



- 2. CurrIQunet: Approval Workflow for Recently Created Proposal Types Steven Schmidt
 - a. The committee presented an issue faculty are experiencing with the Course Inclusion and Course Exclusion proposal types in Meta. Bryan has reached out to Meta and they are working to resolve the issue.
- 3. Edunav: Class Information Dialogs (modality, meeting location, etc.) Steven Schmidt
 - a. The committee discussed some issues related to Edunay, including the following:
 - i. When a student registers for a course, the complete listing of modality and sessions is not always obvious. This is particularly challenging for hybrid courses, where students are seeing an in-person meeting time, but it is not clear that there is an online component starting before the in-person session.
 - ii. The Associated Student Representative for the Riverside Curriculum Committee has said that at times he was unable to enter his student portal, that navigating the system can be very challenging if you are unfamiliar with the system, and at times he has reverted back to using Web Advisor.
 - iii. Waitlist management and add codes are also challenging, particularly for sections that are co-requisites. The waitlists do not feed into the roster. Faculty are having to reach out to students manually to contact them regarding waitlists. Additionally, when students are added from the waitlist, there are times where it appears as though the students have been dropped.
 - b. Steven Schmidt Was it ever possible to use add codes before the start of the semester?
 - i. Brian Johnson No, when providing a student with an add code, students are usually advised to wait until the first day of class.
 - ii. Ann Pfeifle Concurrent enrollment students at the high school level seem to have a special exception in the system.
 - iii. Steven Schmidt So EduNav does not have a different procedure, but there is a contact challenge.
 - iv. Ann Pfeifle At MVC, there have been times where adjusting the section cap has helped with the waitlist concerns. While not a direct solution, this is one possible work around.
- 4. Edunav: Automated Course Selection Process Based on Ed Plan Selection Steven Schmidt
 - a. When Edunav sets up an educational plan, Edunav does not display all the possible course taking options for the student and tends to recommend only certain courses.
 - b. One of the purposes of the community college is to allow students to explore different topics that may help them in discovering a new passion. If a course is being selected for a student, they may miss those opportunities to explore.
 - c. This is also an equity concern for different departments if some courses are promoted over others. The system is taking the place of counseling and is making a recommendation for a generic student. This then becomes the system running the district's curriculum.
 - d. It would be preferable for students to see all the options in a single place and from there the student should be able to select from those choices.



- e. Kelly Douglass Under guided pathways, the student may be seeing specific options for general education courses that help support the major, but that does not mean that the other options should not be visible.
- f. Ellen Brown-Drinkwater For Edunav plans to be official, students must meet with a counselor and the counselor may move or add courses based on student interest/discussion/POS. For a student who uses the system on their own courses are generated based on algorithms, smart rules, and program maps based on POS. The student can move and select different courses. We have asked for students to be able to easily view the GE options in each area. Edunav does show course modality in description.
- g. Ann Pfeifle Is the purpose of the community college to allow for students to explore, or are we just trying to get the student through the completion of a program due to the funding model? We should consider students who have never been on a college campus who register for a class and even drop the class with a W to be considered a success because we have managed to get that student onto a college campus.
- h. Kelly Douglass We need to present a pathway that shows the fulness of the options along the way. We have incredibly talented faculty creating interesting courses that fit general education. We have incredible curriculum, but we don't give a clear view of how to find it.
- 5. Independent Study Courses Kelly Douglass

- 6. Public Facing DE Addenda Ann Pfeifle
 - a. The committee discussed public facing DE addenda. For the time being, they are recommending that Meta insert language onto the DE Reports that recommend that faculty reach out to their department chair for any DE addenda. Bryan will work with Meta to review possible options.
 - b. Additionally, there are changes needed to the DE form to comply with Title 5 updates.
