




Riverside County Taxable Sales, 2004-2014




RCCD Service Area Cities Taxable Sales Trends, 2005-2014








Total Building Permits, 2003-2016 Riverside - San Bernardino - Ontario MSA

Total Building Permits, Single Family Residential Building Permits, Riverside County










RCCD Foundation Revenue and Net Assets







Cities Population, 2012-2017




Riverside County, Ethnicity





Gender, Riverside County, 18 years and over






Riverside County, Occupations of Employed Population Over 16 Years Old








Change in Projected High School Graduates, 2016-17 to 2025-26 by county

RCCD Feeder School Grade Counts, 2009-10 through 2015-16





RCCD Feeder Districts Cohort Graduation Rates, 2015






RCCD Feeder Districts Capture Rates, 2000-2015


RCCD Capture Rates, 2008-2015, by Feeder District






Share of First-Time Students (Under 20) from Feeder Schools, Fall Terms 2000-2015




Fall 2015, First Time Students (Under 20) from RCCD Feeder Districts, <u>English</u> Placement Levels








Riverside CCD Full-Time Equivalent Students, Academic Years 2009/10 through 2014-15




Riverside CCD Total Student Population, by gender




Riverside CCD Total Student Population, larger ethnic groups (2.5K+)




Riverside CCD Total Student Population, by age groups



Riverside CCD Total Student Population, by educational status




Riverside CCD Total Student Population, by education status

Riverside CCD Total Student Population, by day status*





Riverside CCD Total Student Population, by unit load















Riverside CCD Total Financial Aid Awarded, by largest ethnic group




Basic Skills Course Success Rates, Fall Terms









CTE Course Success Rates, Fall Terms





Consecutive Term Persistence, Fall 2013 Cohort, by larger ethnicities



RCCD AA/AS Awards, by larger ethnic groups





RCCD Certificates, by larger ethnic groups





Total RCCD Transfers to any California State University campus





Total RCCD Transfers to any CSU campus, by largest ethnic groups












Student Success Scorecard Completions: RCCD Colleges – AA/AS Degrees





Student Success Scorecard Completions: RCCD Colleges – Transfer Volume Metric













Momentum Point: 30 Units RCCD Colleges – Overall Course Success Rates














Remedial English Momentum Point: State and District College Rates






Remedial <u>ESL</u> Momentum Point: State, District and College Rates


