Riverside Community College District


The Riverside Community College District (RCCD) is the fifth-largest and seventholdest community college district in California. From its origin in 1916 as a single college, RCCD has grown and now serves over 57,000 students in the Inland Southern California region annually.

Riverside City College opened in 1916 to serve the region and in 1991 Moreno Valley and Norco campuses were established. Both campuses gained accreditation as individual colleges and became the 111th and 112th community colleges in California in 2010 as RCCD completed its transition from a single college, multicampus district to a three-college system.



RCCD Highlights:

- RCCD serves a diverse student body reflecting the surrounding population and workforce. In 2016-17, 60% of students were Hispanic, 21% were Caucasian, 8% were African-American, 5% were Asian-Pacific Islanders, and 6% were other ethnicities. All three RCCD colleges are designated as Hispanic Serving Institutions.
- · RCC and Norco College were two of the 20 community colleges selected to participate in the California Guided Pathways Project, a venture designed to substantially increase degree and certificate completion.
- · RCCD is one of the top 25 employers in Riverside County, with more than 2,300 employees.
- The residents of RCCD voted in 2004 to support Measure C, a \$350 million bond measure. Since its passage, improvements have been made at each college and District through upgraded classrooms, labs, electrical systems, technology infrastructure and acquired, constructed and repaired classrooms and facilities.
- In 2016-17 the Grants Office assisted RCCD colleges in securing nearly \$22 million in state, federal, and non-profit grant funding. These awards advance the colleges through the creation of programs, enhance student support services, and partnerships to meet students' needs and create partnerships with industry and the surrounding community.
- The RCCD Office of Economic Development advances business economic growth in western Riverside County by assisting businesses and promoting workforce competitiveness through high quality training and services. The Office of Economic Development, located adjacent to March Air Reserve Base, includes three divisions: Center for International Trade Development, Procurement Assistance Center and Customized Training Solutions.





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Moreno Valley College

Moreno Valley College offers comprehensive transfer, degree, and certificate programs, and is designated as the health and public safety college within the Riverside Community College District. Its partnerships with the Riverside University Health System, the Riverside County Sheriff's Department, CAL Fire, K-12 school districts and several other entities ensure leading-edge programs in allied health and public services.

MVC's **Veterans Resource Center** served 591 students in 2016-17 and provides services to Veterans and their dependents.

The 2016-17 graduates of the **Dental Assisting program** earned a 100% pass rate on the California Registered Dental Assistant Examination.

MVC was one of 24 colleges to receive a **Maker Implementation Grant** from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. The College developed an innovative education model for students. The funding facilitates the addition of equipment in support of the conversion of the STEM Mobile Innovation Center to a Mobile Maker Space.

MVC was honored for its **Wildland Fire Academy** by the Workforce and Economic Development Division at the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. The Wildland Fire Academy teaches students to handle wildland fire safety, weather effects, wildland fuels, wildland fire behavior, initial attack methods, using support equipment, using topographic maps, strategy and tactics, and air attack operations.

The MVC campus is home to three **Early and Middle College High School** programs. They are a partnership between the College and Moreno Valley, Nu View and Val Verde unified school districts.

MVC students continue to research the area's swallow population which make the College home each spring. The **Flying with Swallows** (FWS) project, funded through a three-year National Science Foundation grant, provides students personal and professional experiences of conducting undergraduate research, thus preparing them for transfer and graduate-level research.

Norco College

Norco College offers comprehensive transfer, degree, and certificate programs, and is designated as the engineering, technology, and manufacturing college within the Riverside Community College District. It is located in one of Southern California's major corridors for the transportation of goods and services throughout California and to the Midwest. Programs are designed to meet industry needs.

Military Times ranked Norco College as one of the Best Colleges for Veterans for the third time in four years, while Military Friendly® named the College a bronzelevel Military Friendly® School Award recipient for 2018. The College served 248 Veterans in 2016-17.

Norco College is the recipient of a \$2 million allocation in the 2017-18 State of California Budget to establish a **Veterans Resource Center** which will expand and enhance programs and services and military training course articulation for Veteran students. The allocation and program are the firsts of a kind statewide. The Center will serve as the model for community colleges in California.

Norco College students volunteered approximately **6,240 hours** towards community service programs and projects in 2016-17.

Norco College's award-winning **Summer Advantage program** served over 2,180 since it began in 2012, assisting graduating high school students increase their college-level preparedness in English and mathematics.

Norco College is home to one of the largest middle college high schools in the nation, **John F. Kennedy (JFK) Middle College High School**. The more than 550 students attend high school and college classes at Norco College. In 2016-17, JFK students completed 5,835 units and 21 graduating seniors earned 35 associate degrees.

Norco College entered into a partnership with the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to serve inmates at the **California Rehabilitation Center** in Norco. The rehabilitation program began in the fall 2017 semester with 105 students enrolling in English, communications and guidance courses.

Riverside City College operates as a comprehensive liberal arts and sciences college, and is known for programs in nursing, performing arts, science and technology, and career & technical education. It is the largest and oldest of the three RCCD colleges and is known for innovative partnerships with K-12 and universities.

RCC has the second largest **Associate Degree for Nursing** (ADN) program in California with more than 400 full-time nursing students, and graduates close to 180 registered nurses and 50 vocational nurses annually. After completing the program, 85% of the RN students are employed in the Inland Empire.

The **RCC Marching Tigers** were selected to perform in the 2018 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade. The 2018 appearance will mark the third time the band has performed in the iconic parade.

RCC served 1,021 student Veterans in 2016-17 and offers a full-service **Veterans Resource Center** for Veterans and their dependents.

RCC's **Model United Nations** team was named Outstanding Delegation and two students were honored as Outstanding Delegates at the United Nations New York Conference. In addition, two students won the Outstanding Delegation Award in Japan at the United Nations International Conference.

RCC's **Jazz Ensemble** won the Reno Jazz Festival competition, the largest music competition in the country. The Jazz Ensemble and Jazz Combo group were selected by *Downbeat Magazine* as the nation's best among community colleges.

RCC had three students capture medals at the **SkillsUSA National Championships** in Louisville, KY. With two gold medal winnings, the Applied Digital Media program has produced a gold-medal winning student in seven of the last nine competitions. The team also brought home a bronze medal in Graphic Communications.

Riverside City College is located in the downtown Riverside area, part of the 41st Congressional District, the 31st Senate District, and the 60th and 61st Assembly Districts.
