One District, Three Colleges






Student **ENROLLMENT**



Education

Attending an RCCD college is not only the smart choice, it is an affordable choice. The cost to attend a California community college is \$46 per unit, meaning that a three unit class costs just \$138. For students who qualify, there are various financial aid opportunities – such as the California College Promise Grant (formerly known as the BOG Fee Waiver), Federal Pell Grant, workstudy and even local scholarships offered by the colleges. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (fafsa.gov) or California Dream Act Application (dream.csac.ca.gov) for ways to help fund your education.

COMPARE THE COST

A California resident enrolled in 12 units is considered a full-time student. Therefore, the cost for four classes (\$46 x 12 units) is \$552 per semester / \$1,104 per year.

Tuition at a California State University is about \$5,500 annually, while tuition at a University of California school would cost approximately \$12,600 each year. Tuition for private institutions typically starts at \$40,000 annually.

Other expenses include books, material fees, supplies, transportation and parking.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES



Student Service programs designed to help students be successful in college. Students are empowered by enhancing personal and educational achievements through comprehensive programs and services, such as those mentioned below. Student Services is dedicated to educating, serving, supporting, and promoting student success for a diverse community of learners in a student-centered environment.

CalWORKs is a public assistance program that provides cash aid and services to eligible families that have a child(ren) in the home.

DISABILITY SERVICES provides students with comprehensive support services and accommodations. Students with psychological, medical, mobility, deaf/hard of hearing, learning disabilities and ADHD can receive services. Veterans, who need help with stress or any other psychological, physical, sensory or cognitive injury in order to attain educational and career goals, may also receive services.

EOPS - EXTENDED OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMS & SERVICES is a statefunded student support services program whose
purpose is to provide special recruitment, retention,
and transition services to eligible students.

FINANCIAL AID consists of grants, workstudy programs and scholarships to assist with educational expenses. Every student is encouraged to apply for financial aid. Visit fafsa.gov for more information.

GUIDED PATHWAYS creates structured educational experiences that support each student from point of entry to attainment of high-quality postsecondary credentials and careers.

GUARDIAN SCHOLARS is a comprehensive program with a goal of supporting former foster youth in their efforts to gain a university, community college or trade school education.

HEALTH AND PSYCHOLOGICAL

SERVICES helps students maintain optimum physical, mental, and emotional health. The office provides medical services including health screening, physical examinations, medical assessment, and immunizations as well as professing counseling.

HONORS PROGRAM is committed to providing learning opportunities and services to prepare students to be competitive in reaching their future goals.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS offers international students the opportunity to US-style academics as well as lower-tuition options than the University of California and Cal State University systems. Community colleges also offer international students an opportunity to improve English-language skills and the chance to experience various majors.

PUENTE is a national-award winning program that has helped educationally disadvantaged students enroll in four-year colleges and universities, earn degrees, and return to the community as leaders and mentors to future generations.

PROMISE PROGRAM provides financial support to first-time college students. Promise Program can provide free tuition for the first year of college (RCC and MVC are funding the program for the first two years of students' college education.).

SCHOLARSHIP opportunities are available through the RCCD Foundation. They help reduce educational expenses, are free money, and can generally be used toward any expense related to your college education.

STUDY ABROAD offers an unparalleled international education experience. Students get international education in its broadest sense. The program encourages an individual to learn, understand and care about the world beyond their community and to transcend culturally conditioned, ethnocentric perspectives, perceptions and behaviors.

TRIO PROGRAMS are federally funded student support services dedicated to helping income-eligible, first-generation students, and individuals with disabilities.

UMOJA program is designed to provide essential educational support and services to increase the academic success, retention, degree completion, and transfer rates of African-American and other student populations.

VETERAN SERVICES offers assistance with financial aid, military benefits, counseling, and academic support.



TRANSFER Programs

Each of the colleges offer guaranteed admission programs, such as the Ascociate Degree for Transfer program to the California State University system. Students awarded an AA-T or AS-T degree are guaranteed admission with junior standing somewhere in the CSU system and given priority admission consideration to their local CSU campus or to a program that is deemed similar to their community college major. This priority does not guarantee admission to specific majors or campuses.

The UC system also gives community college students priority over other transfer applicants, and many campuses offer guaranteed admission for well-prepared transfer students.

Each college has transfer agreements to partner colleges and universities. Visit a college transfer center to learn more about the transfer programs available.

CAREER & TECHNICAL Education

Career & Technical Education (CTE) provides students with the academic and technical skills, knowledge and training necessary to be successful in future careers. RCCD colleges offer more than 150 CTE programs that prepare students for career opportunities in high-skill and high-demand occupations or success at a four-year university. GETTING STARTED

1 APPLY

Visit any of the colleges' websites: mvc.edu, norcocollege.edu, or rcc.edu; click on the **Apply** button; login to **OpenCCC** (you'll need to create an account if you don't already have one); and complete the application.

You will be asked to select your **home college**, the location where you will receive services such as financial aid and counseling. Once your application has been submitted and processed, you can proceed to the next steps in the enrollment process.

* You are encouraged to apply for Financial Aid at <u>fafsa.gov</u> or <u>dream.csac.ca.gov</u>. Remember to select Moreno Valley College, Norco College, or Riverside City College as your institution.

ORIENTATION, ASSESSMENT AND ADVISEMENT

To ensure you're on the right path to enrollment, you will need to complete the following:

- **Orientation** introduces you to the terminology, academic programs, student services and planning tools to succeed.
- **Assessment** (testing) includes English, reading and math placement. The assessment tests are designed to evaluate your knowledge to place you in the courses best suited for your skills.
- Advisement provides you with information and the courses to take to meet your academic goals.
- 3 REGISTER

After completing steps 1 and 2, you will receive an email with an appointment date and time to register for classes. On or after your appointment date, you can register through **MyPortal**, which can be accessed through the link on the college's home page.

A **RETURNING STUDENT** is a student who previously attended any college within the Riverside Community College District but missed a Fall or Spring semester.

APPLY

Associate Degrees for Transfer

The Associate in Art for Transfer (AA-T) and the Associate in Science for Transfer (AS-T) degrees are two-year associate degrees that are fully transferable to the California State University system and are no more than 60 semester units.

With these Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT) students who meet the CSU's minimum eligibility requirements are guaranteed priority admission to a CSU campus, though not necessarily to a particular campus or major.


