

Summary of the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee Proceedings and Activities 2004-05

Meetings of the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee

The Committee conducts its meetings in accordance with the provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Public Meeting Act, Government Code Sections 54950 et seq. Meeting notices and agendas are sent to members of the Committee within the required period and are posted at the three RCC campus locations. Meeting notices, agendas, minutes and documents and reports received by the Committee members are a matter of public record and are available through the RCC website http://www.rcc.edu/cboc.

<u>Meeting – November 4, 2004</u> RCC Alumni House 3564 Ramona Dr., Riverside

- Briefing on the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee's role and responsibilities Outside counsel David Casnocha briefed the Committee on its role and responsibilities as outlined under the California Education, Proposition 39, and the Committee's adopted bylaws. Mr. Casnocha also reviewed the process governing the appointment of the Committee Chair and determination of member's terms.
- Review of Series A & B Bond Issuance In August 2004, the District issued the first Measure C bond for \$65 million. Tax rates, the projected schedule for future bond issuances, and the RCCD Facilities Improvement Plan were reviewed.

- Review Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee website (presenter: Mr. Darren Dong); Committee recommended several changes and additions, i.e., the inclusion of project plans, progress photos, and a general FAQ section.

	 Discuss the Independent Auditor Selection Process for Measure C Bonds Under Proposition 39 regulations, the District is required to hire an independent auditor to conduct annual performance and financial audits. After hearing the District's presentation regarding the Request for Proposal (RFP), the Committee expressed concern about the possibility of a conflict of interest or the appearance of "less-than-adequate" independent oversight if the same auditing firm was hired to conduct both the District's annual audits and the Measure C audits.
	- Approve the presentation of a written annual report to the RCCD Board of Trustees as part of Chair Blumenthal's verbal report to the Board on August 23, 2005.
	- Approve submission of a request to the RCC Board of Trustees asking that members Jamil Dada, George Beloz, and Cynthia Urrutia be reappointed to serve a second term (two-year) on the Committee.
	- Committee members discussed the possibility of allowing members to participate by video-conferencing (if needed) as well as the idea of broadcasting future meetings to increase community access and participation.
	- Approve a planned tour for Committee members to the Moreno Valley Campus, the March Education Center, the Dental Hygiene Program, and the Ben Clark Public Safety & Training Center on August 24, 2005.
	- Approved changing the September 22, 2005 meeting location from the Riverside City College campus to the Norco Campus to accommodate a Committee tour of the Norco facilities.
