


Distinguished Public Service



Kevin Bash

Norco Councilmember Kevin Bash has been a resident of Norco for more than 50 years and his contributions to the residents and the community are numerous.

He began his career in city government after an unfair zoning issue, which prompted his involvement in the City of Norco's Parks and Recreation Commission and Historic Preservation Commission for more than a decade, ultimately leading to serving on the City Council in 2009. Since then Bash has been involved in hundreds of

community events and projects. His priorities for Norco include attracting and fostering commerce; developing a consistent funding stream for city services; maintaining open space and animal keeping; education; and supporting programs for veterans, seniors and youth.

Bash is passionate about education, which is why he holds a strong relationship with Norco College and the Riverside Community College District. He serves on several committees that help advance college goals and initiatives including the President's Advisory Committee.

Bash holds a baccalaureate degree from the University of California, Riverside, and a master's degree in Fine Arts from the University of California, San Diego. He has worked as a professional actor for much of his life, appearing in hundreds of commercials and television series and is a member of the Screen Actor's Guild.

In his spare time, Bash is a published author penning books about the history of Norco. He is known as the city's historian, possessing knowledge of local history and an extensive collection of historic artifacts. He has an enduring commitment to the future restoration of the Lake Norconian Club Hotel. He also practices Aikido, has earned a fifth degree black belt and is now a master teacher.

Bash has served on several local boards and organizations including the Economic Development Advisory Council, the Senior Advisory Committee, Norco Schools Committee, Measure GG Oversight Committee, the George Ingalls Veterans Memorial Executive Committee, and is on the Board of Directors of Corona Regional Medical Center.
