The Board was provided four Century Circle Grant applications for review, with two being recommended for approval and two needing more information before a decision can be rendered. After review and discussion, the Board agreed to approve the two recommended applications. The Board also agreed it was best to send the other two applications back to the submitter as there was insufficient information and a lack of clear alignment with the criteria such as college and district priorities. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

Secretary Sergio Diaz, Chair of the Nomination Committee, provided a quick report to the Board. The committee met in December and will meet again at the end of January. Work has begun to collect names of potential nominees to be vetted and E.D. Kaatz has scheduled some lunch meetings. The Board has three (3) members terming off in June and three (3) members who will be completing their first term in June. The three members finishing their first term have been contacted to gauge interest in serving a second term. The committee is confident there will be a good slate of nominees to present at the next full Board meeting for approval.

Nomination Committee Report

E.D. Kaatz provided an update on the organization's fundraising efforts. The goal for the 24-25 fiscal year is \$2.25 million. To date, the Foundation has received \$932,000. The organization is in the process of drafting a new Strategic Plan for 2025-2030. The goal is to have the plan completed by the summer. E.D. Kaatz also asked the Board for volunteers to serve on the Scholarship Committee to help review applications.

Executive Director's Report

After some discussion about the new political atmosphere, the Board agreed to reactive the ad-hoc Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee to discuss strategic planning and potential changes to the organization due to recent executive orders.

OTHER BUSINESS

Other Business

Riverside Community College District (RCCD) Chancellor, Dr. Wolde-Ab Isaac, thanked the Board for their service and discussed the Foundation's role in funding and potentially leveraging more resources from corporations. Chancellor Isaac highlighted the organization's collaboration with the local school districts and the need to improve access to higher education. The goal is to create a more dynamic and robust system that can respond to the needs of the community.

Chancellor's Remarks

Moreno Valley College (MVC) Interim President Dr. FeRita Carter shared updates with the Board. MVC is at 124% of its winter enrollment target and 87% for the spring. The college hosted an educational leaders panel as part of the Moreno Valley Chamber of Commerce Leadership Academy to discuss fostering collaboration among education institutions, addressing equity in education, and preparing students for the workforce. MVC was awarded \$25,000 from the Edison Foundation for the Fire Academy. MVC was also awarded a bachelor's degree program proposal in emergency management.

College Presidents' Remarks

Norco College (NC) President Dr. Monica Green thanked the Board. NC is 106% of the winter enrollment target and 91% for the spring. NC is launching the President's Circle, an alternative funding initiative to support vital operations, scholarship, and programming. NC will also host the 3rd annual Industry Partners and Award Breakfast on March 28. NC was awarded \$25,000 from the Edison Foundation to support STEM students.

Riverside City College (RCC) President Dr. Claire Oliveros thanked the Board for their service. President Oliveros highlighted several achievements and collaborations, including a grant from the US Department of Agriculture for an Innovative Soil Science program. RCC is also being scouted as a potential pre-training site for the LA Olympics in 2028.
