INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

President Hall provided a brief update. At the last meeting, the Committee reviewed a draft of the Strategic Plan. E.D. Kaatz and A.D. Johnson have done a great job laying the foundation for the plan and the Committee will continue to review it in a couple weeks.

Executive Committee Report

Chair Donna Grant gave an update on the scholarship application process. The Committee met in February and were given access to begin reviewing applications at the beginning of March. The deadline to complete reviews is the end of the month and each member will review roughly 50 applications.

Scholarship Committee Report

Executive Director Jeffry Kaatz provided an update on the organization's fundraising efforts. The goal for the 24-25 fiscal year is \$2.25 million. To date, the Foundation has received \$1.14 million. The organization is in the process of drafting a new Strategic Plan for 2025-2030. The goal is to have the plan completed by the summer. E.D. Kaatz encouraged the Board to make their annual gift, as 33% of the Board has participated in giving. The Board was also notified a ballot will be distributed in April to vote on the 2025-2026 Board Officers. E.D. Kaatz invited recommendations for the various Board positions.

Executive Director's Report

OTHER BUSINESS

Riverside Community College District (RCCD) Chancellor, Dr. Wolde-Ab Isaac, thanked Chancellor's Remarks the Board for their service. Chancellor Isaac announced the launch of a Bachelor's degree in Emergency Management at Moreno Valley College. The District is working to collaborate with the surrounding school districts to increase college enrollment rates and graduation rates and the District would like to double the amount of students participating in dual enrollment classes. Progress has been made thanks to the bond that passed in the last election cycle. The state has contributed \$153 million so far and the District has entered the planning phases for the Corona Educational Center and the Inland Empire Technical Trade Center.

Moreno Valley College (MVC) Interim President Dr. FeRita Carter shared updates with the Board. MVC is the first community college to launch a bachelor's degree in Emergency Management. MVC has also started distributing a bi-weekly newsletter with updates to the campus community call the Mountain Lion Update.

College Presidents' Remarks

Norco College (NC) President Dr. Monica Green thanked the Board. NC will host the 3rd annual Industry Partners and Award Breakfast on March 28 and has received roughly \$25,000 in sponsorships for the event.

Riverside City College (RCC) President Dr. Claire Oliveros thanked the Board for their service. RCC is moving forward with student housing in partnership with UCR. The application portal will open soon and students will get notified if they have been awarded housing that will be available for move-in in August.

U.S. Bank representatives, Johnny Liu and Timothy Davidson, provided a brief portfolio presentation for the Board. Updates on the current market situation and portfolio performance were provided. Despite the volatile market, the diversified portfolio with a mix of stocks and bonds has been beneficial. There are concerns about a recession due to policy uncertainty and potential tariffs. Tim emphasized the importance of diversification, including international investments, which have helped maintain portfolio stability during the volatile periods.
