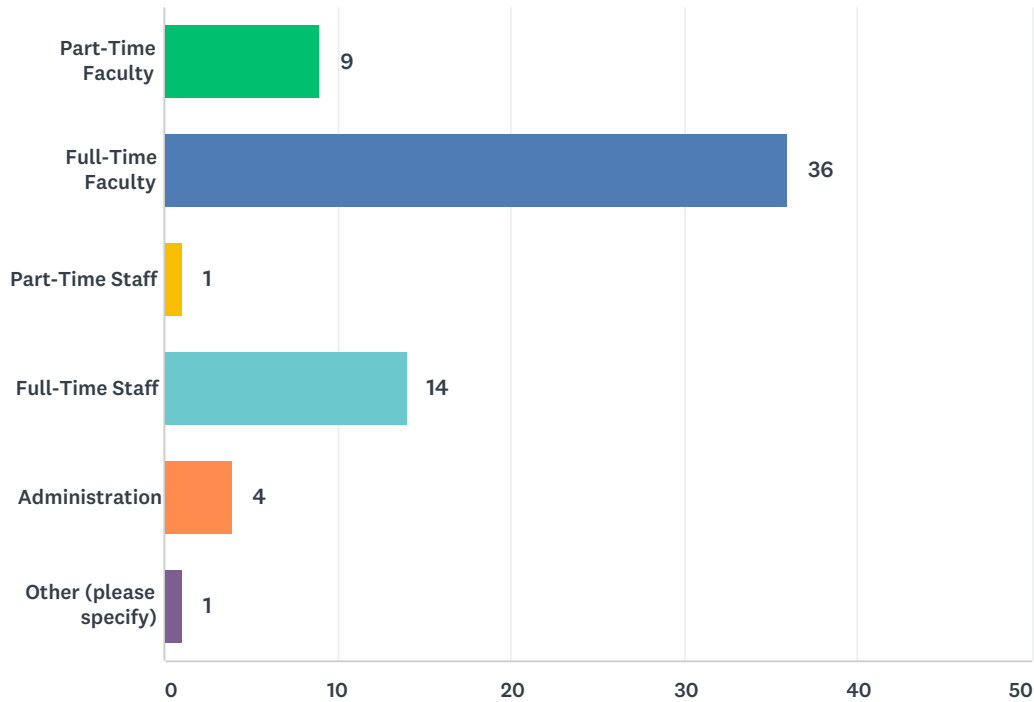


Q1 What is your affiliation with Moreno Valley College?

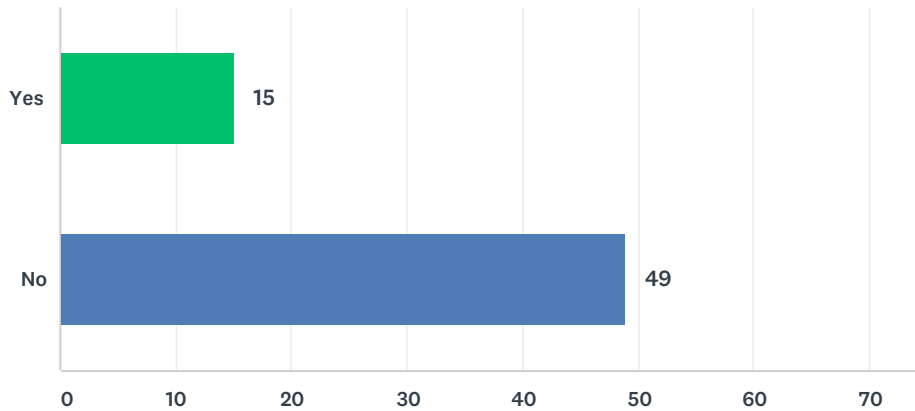

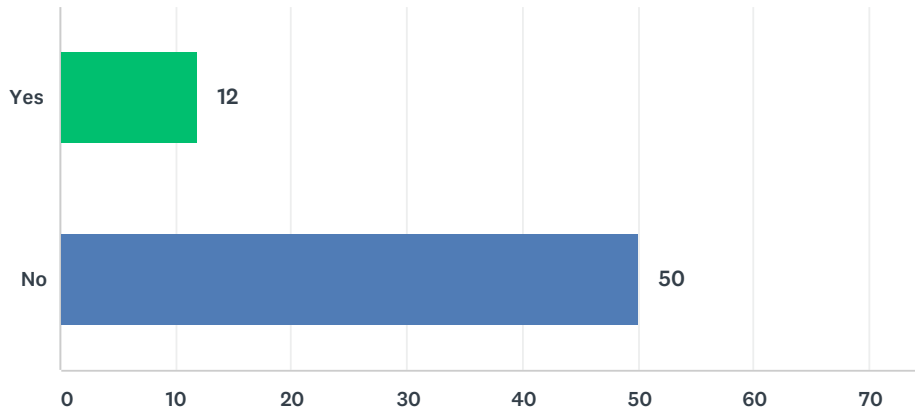

On one of the slides in the presentation, it added faculty mentors as well as potentially faculty data analysts(?). It was mentioned that there was a stipend for this at Santa Monica college, but this data analysis should not fall back on faculty. It should fall on Institutional Effectiveness. If we are going to have faculty mentors and data analysts(?), this is placing a lot more work on faculty that isn't related to teaching. Although there may be a stipend, someone will HAVE to do the job. Guided Pathways School Structure Survey

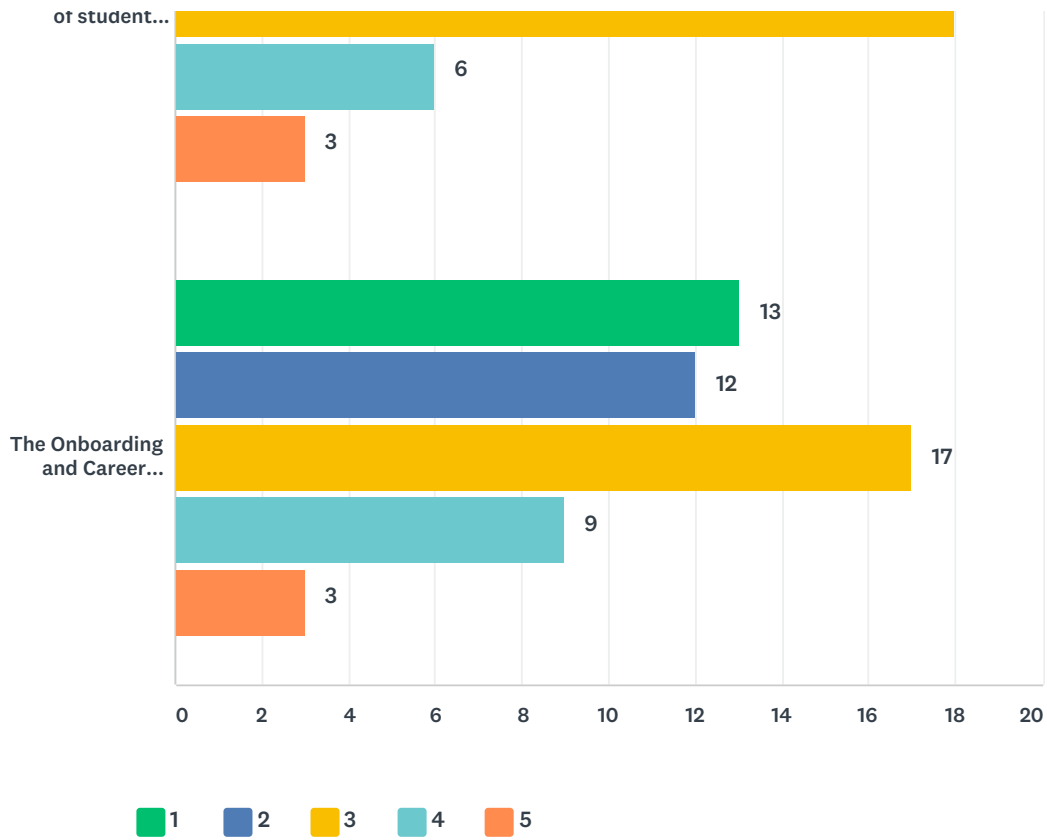
