Umoja MVC is dedicated to increase the number of educationally underserved students who enroll in our institution, earn their degrees and certificates, transfer to the four-year college and/or university, and return to the community as leaders and mentors for future generations.

Highlights and Accomplishments: : Highlights and Accomplishments: : UMOJA SERVICES- Umoja services provided include, but are not limited to:

UMOJA Moreno Valley College Presented Historically Black Colleges/Universities (HBCU) Caravan Transfer Fair, February 8, 2017 highlighted over 25 colleges and universities who were in attendance, 400 students attended, over 250 students were accepted on the spot, college applications fees were waived, students received scholarships on the spot, high school student, MVC student and the community attended. UMOJA MVC goal was to Support our Student Transfer Completion, Empower our Student with Access, Equal to Student Success.

UMOJA Moreno Valley College Presents UC President Janet Napolitano 125 Umoja students, faculty and staff attended. November 9, 2017 the highlighted message to our Umoja students was a UC education is within their reach. The UC Chancellor, MVC Chancellor, MVC President, MVC Board members, two former MVC alumni student panelist who created the 1st Umoja program on a UC campus, Umoja Executive Board members, 5 supportive Umoja community college programs and MVC Umoja team.

March 20, 2018 40 Umoja MVC student and faculty attended and facilitated a women's empowerment luncheon in Riverside. The theme was "I am every woman". Many of our UMOJA students experience emotional and educational barriers. The presenter's topics included Educators, Authors/ CEO and, financial consultants. Reporting success of 100%.

Feb 2-3 2018, 25 students who have applied for transfer to UCR R'UMOJA day. Topics included "What's next?" "Financial", "It takes a village" and "Do UC Us", How to be impactful on campus, college presentations, tours, and transfer resources/ fair.

80% of UMOJA students expressed their physical/ mental health concerns. Umoja provided resources for staying in school through supportive resources and UMOJA supportive services.

Umoja MVC provides weekly/ month seminars, speaker and workshops for our students such as AMEND conference, UMOJA Symposium, and the MVC diversity summit

workshop. The UMOJA students and faculty provided one workshop 2 sessions. This provided additional retention, success, and resources for Umoja students. E.g. career, motivational, and lifestyle changes.

The mentoring program, which enables over 50 students to receive mentoring, services through our UMOJA mentoring component. The mentors were provided for all students who agreed to a mentor assignment. Mentors were recruited from campus and community. Umoja mentor motivational and professional development seminars, which were provided as well as group mentoring in addition to guest speakers.

The UMOJA MVC graduation and recognition celebration. 49 UMOJA students participated in this event. Approx. 150 individuals, faculty and staff serving as community outreach and empowerment towards success attended this yearly event.

The Umoja College promise summer, bridge program at MVC has 53 students from our high school, offering a learning community designed to increase students, academic and personal success through the structuring of the learning environment. The learning community focuses on addressing the academic needs of students by providing counseling to assist students. This intensive summer program is for highly motivated high school seniors who have graduated and would like to prepare for the upcoming semester. The program provides English enrichment workshops, community building as well as guidance courses designed to increase college success for our first year students.

Major Developments and Changes: Major Developments and Changes: The Umoja center opened during winter session 2018 to present. The drop-in reports through sign-in sheets show over 800 student utilized the UMOJA center/ office space for Abbreviated SEP, CSEP, intrusive counseling, career counseling, , transfer counseling, in house tutoring, snacks and continuous support. There is a direct correlation between utilization of the UMOJA resources and passing grades.

May 25, 2018 USC /Black history museum tour was a great success with 63 students and 4 faculty in attendance. This collaboration with the UMOJA learning community English 1A GUI 47 and HIS 15 (which is a UMOJA support class). This event was absolutely empowering.

The learning community in the fall will offer ENG 91, and ENG 1A. The guidance courses will remain the same.
